Bark River Harris Leo Club/we currently have 39 Active members in our Leo Club. Our Leo Club is doing their Annual Pumpkin Painting at Pinecrest Medical Center today, our local nursing home. We recently had a fun day for our members at the Getzloff Corn maze and Pumpkin patch. There were about 14 members that we able to attend. Last Friday we had a Hat Day at school. The students are able to wear a hat in school all day for \$1.00. We collect this money and donate it to either Bay Cliff or other Lions Clubs causes. With this hat day we collected around \$112.00.
