Featured Partner: Northwoods Airlifeline

Northwoods AirLifeLine (NWALL) is our featured partner! NWALL is a non-profit organization of volunteer pilots from Michigan’s Upper Peninsula and northeast Wisconsin who donate their time and aircraft to help patients and their families with medical needs for services not found locally.

Children with cancer or other illnesses must travel for medical appointments, care and treatment outside of our area. NWALL not only provides flight transport to these children and their families, but also eases the emotional burden of the time and cost of traveling, sometimes over 900 miles round trip.

Since founding by Lion Bob Larson from Witch Lake in 1989, well over 3000 missions have been flown to destinations in lower Mich-

igan, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Illinois, Ohio and Missouri, all at no cost to the individual.

Thank you, NWALL, for all you do for “Yoooper” families! Quote from a U.P. family battling childhood cancer:

“It has been such a tremendous gift, knowing we would be able to make our daughters' appointments in Ann Arbor without having to take two or three days to drive every week. NWALL has made it possible for us to be able to spend more time concentrating on our family's health instead of travel. It has been such a huge relief and we are more grateful than we could ever express.”

Last year, the riders raised over \$50,000 for our families and the programs that serve them. When A Kid Like Me Fights Cancer

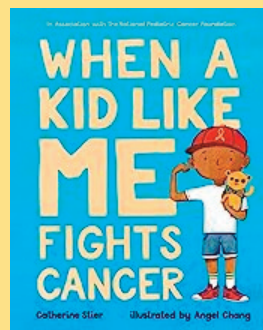
When A Kid Like Me Fights Cancer is a book that will speak to children of all ages on their journey.

It takes the perspective of a young boy, just diagnosed, and all the new things he discovers along the way. A line about learning about cancer, "it's just that sometimes something goes wrong inside the body. Then a good kid has to deal with a bad disease."

The story line was developed with encouragement of the National Pediatric Cancer Foundation and authored by Michigan native Catherine Stier, herself a cancer survivor. It has bright and bold illustrations by Angel Chang.

The 32-page book is for ages 2 and up and is published by Albert Whitman & Company. Hardback (2019) and paperback (2021) are currently available on Amazon.

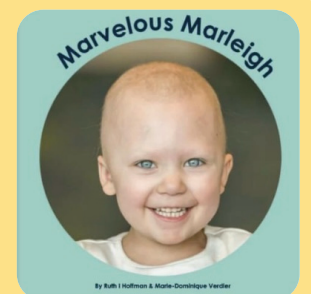
Marvelous Marleigh

In this real-life picture book, *Marvelous Marleigh* walks us through her treatment and hospital stays in order to learn more about her experience with cancer. Using simple language, real photos, and a fun mirror at the end, young children diagnosed with cancer will identify with Marleigh and be able to reflect upon their own experiences through a shared journey.

We love reading this sweet and simple book to our daughter with neuroblastoma who is almost 3 years old. *Marvelous Marleigh* makes us smile and laugh, but it also opens the door to talk about the more difficult things our daughter has had to go through, as well. I highly recommend this book for families dealing with a childhood cancer diagnosis, along with other young children who may have a sibling, cousin, or friend with cancer.

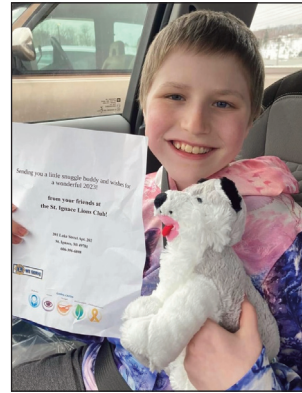
