#### Jesus Christ Is Risen! He Is Risen Indeed!

Another Easter has arrived, so once again we celebrate and give thanks for the New Life given to us by Christ. Yet, we celebrate it not only on Easter, but every day that we have to give thanks to the Lord! Psalm 16 can help us to celebrate Easter.

Psalm 16 is a love letter to the God who first loved us. We recognize the safety we find in God, a safety that we have even when things do not go our way in this life. We see the proof of this refuge: for though Christ was beaten, killed, and put into the grave, he came to new life again! And, not just into normal life, but he returned transformed! The resurrection reminds us that

even when we struggle or suffer, those struggles are not the end. Resurrection—new life—is the end!

Psalm 16 gives thanks for the blessings that we have received from God. "I have no good apart from you" and "I have a goodly heritage", the psalmist proclaims. We give thanks to God for all the good in our lives, even in difficult times. Scientific studies have been done on gratitude and have shown that grateful people are generally happier people. When we're grateful, we see the good and put the good to the forefront of our eyes and minds, emboldening our hearts to endure and to recognize love, even when it's difficult. Easter does not wipe away every pain and hardship in this life. Nor is it meant to make us feel guilty for "not being happy enough". Easter offers hope by reminding us of the good gifts of God in our lives. Though we travel through darkness, the light endures. Though we don't have everything we want, what we have is a gracious gift from God. Easter gives us eyes to see this.

Psalm 16 reminds us of the precious relationship we have with God. "I bless the LORD who gives me counsel; in the night also my heart instructs me," says the Psalm writer. Easter reminds us to listen for the voice of God in our lives, for our God is a Living God. Some of the worst that we humans do to each other was done to Jesus: mocking, betrayal, beatings, oppression, starvation, torture, and murder. Yet, through it all, Jesus returned forgiveness, care, and love to the crowds, and when Jesus was transformed to new life, he shared that new life with his followers. The One who has endured these things not only continually offers new life to us, he counsels us on how to live well and to love, even when it's difficult. Easter reminds us that love and forgiveness are far more powerful and life-changing than hate or revenge. Easter also leads us into a relationship with the God who loves us so much!

Psalm 16 turns us once again to God's path: "You show me the path of life. In your presence there is fullness of joy; in your right hand are pleasures forevermore." We are not left alone in this life. We are not abandoned. In fact, even death cannot tear us from God's arms. Easter proves this point in dramatic fashion and points us once again down God's road. Jesus shows us the way in life. Jesus brings us joy. Easter is the Great Turning, where things are turned around: hope shines through what was only despair, life comes from death, grace springs from torment. This is true not only once, on this day, long ago, but it is true for each of us every day. Easter reminds us to look for it—to look for Christ at work in our lives and in the world and to see that work with wonder. Remember that God is with you and loves you more deeply than you can imagine.

Blessings to you always in the name of the One who brought forth life from death.

Spring has sprung and with it are many reminders of new life and rebirth. We celebrate the warmer days, the grass greening up, trees budding, and flowers blooming. For Christians, this time of year brings the most important celebration of new life -

Jesus' resurrection from the death on Easter Sunday. Children may focus on bunnies, baskets, and candy on Easter, so it is important for us to share with them the real reason we rejoice – Jesus's empty tomb.

The events of Holy Week and Easter may be frightening or confusing to younger children. Share the message in age-appropriate ways by using these tips:

**Ages 2 to 5**: You can say that the people who hated Jesus nailed him to a cross on Good Friday and left him there until he died. Explain that Jesus' friends were sad and afraid until Jesus came back to life three days later on Easter Sunday. And because of Jesus, we no longer have to fear death.

**Ages 6 to 9**: Fairness is important to kids at this age, so as you explain Good Friday, tell kids that Jesus was willing to die for us because He loves us so much and Jesus knew that he would be raised from the tomb on Easter Sunday. Through his death and resurrection, our sins have been forgiven and we will have eternal life because of Jesus.

**Ages 10 to 12**: Preteens are familiar with the details of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Most are ready for the "why". You can tell them that when Adam and Eve first sinned, humans had a broken relationship with God. And, the only way to help us turn back to God was for Jesus to live with us, teach us and ultimately take our sins away by his death and resurrection. Through Jesus, we receive God's love, grace, the joy of forgiveness and eternal life. Alleluia!

Along with attending worship, Sunday school, and reading the Bible and books of faith, engaging in family activities together help with the understanding of the Easter message and for making wonderful family memories that can be passed through the generations. Here are a few fun ideas:

**Prayer Eggs** – During Holy week, use plastic eggs to encourage your family to talk to God. Place slips of paper with prayer topics inside the eggs. Make enough eggs for each person to open one each day during Holy Week. Include praises and thank-you's, and prayer requests for friends, family, and the community. Open the eggs at meals or

bedtime and pray together for the requests. Place the read prayer eggs in a basket on Easter morning to celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

**New Life** – Go on a nature walk to collect lots of twigs. Help children use a low-temp glue gun to attach the twigs to the outside of a clean soup can. Then fill the "vase" with fresh flowers as you talk about how the twigs are like our lives before Jesus (dead and broken) and how the flowers represent our lives with Jesus (new and alive).

**Jelly Bean Joy** – Use colorful jelly beans to remind your children of Jesus' love and the joy we receive when we follow him. In this poem, each color represents part of the Easter account:

Orange is for the sins we've done Red is for the blood of God's Son White is for the grace He gives Green is for new life in Him Yellow is for your place in heaven Invite Jesus into your life and be forgiven!

God's blessings to you and your family as you celebrate Jesus' love for us this Easter!

#### Darkness to Light Child Protection Training Offered

As people of faith, we are called to care for "the least of these" and "the smallest of these." Faith leaders (pastors, council members, Sunday School teachers, youth leaders, parents) and all who are interested in creating a

safer community for our children are invited to a Stewards of Children<sup>®</sup> training on **Monday, May 8** at **5:00 p.m. at Emmanual Lutheran** (2901 13<sup>th</sup> St, Menominee). This 2.5 hour program is offered by Pastor Kari Vadis (Trinity, Rhinelander), an Authorized Facilitator, and is approved for 2.5 contact hours of continuing education (2.5 CEUs).

Darkness to Light is a national not-for-profit leader in the prevention of child sexual abuse. Guided by the vision of a world where children can grow up happy, healthy, and safe, Darkness to Light is committed to empowering people to prevent child sexual abuse. They believe that protecting children is an adult's responsibility, and that through education and training, adults will be empowered to act. Stewards of Children<sup>®</sup> is an evidenceinformed, award-winning, two-hour training that teaches adults to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. Through interviews with child sexual abuse survivors, experts, and treatment providers, Stewards of Children<sup>®</sup> teaches adults practical actions they can take to reduce instances of child sexual abuse in their organizations, families, and communities.

This program is sponsored and supported by the Northern Great Lakes Synod Youth Ministry Team. There is no charge to attend the class, but pre-registration is encouraged by emailing Stefanie Ehle (<u>youthcoordinator@nglsynod.org</u>) to ensure enough workbooks are available.
