#### Jesus Christ Is Risen! He Is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!!

We continue to celebrate Easter. We do so every Sunday of the year, as each Sunday is a resurrection celebration, but we especially rejoice in the resurrection during these 40 days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday—the Easter Season. I hope you are enjoying these Easter days, not only with chocolate and jellybeans, but more importantly with Word and prayer and Sacrament. We have life because Christ is alive. Jesus Christ is risen!

Psalm 98 invites us to celebrate. How? With songs and praises! With trumpets and horns! With joyful noises! I love the *abandon* found in these verses. I feel a swelling of joy when I read them. Do you? In day-to-day life, we often get bogged down in routine and the pressures of life. We see the bills we need to pay and we do the same task at work that we've done 10,000 times before. We sense aches and pains in our bodies and can sometimes get trapped by them. We may even become listless at times. Psalm 98 invites us to allow our hearts and our joy to swell, even in the midst of all these troubles in life. We can see Easter joy in the words of this Psalm and respond. Christ's resurrection doesn't take away our earthly woes, but it does instill in us the reminder that those woes won't last forever. Christ's new life for us doesn't take away our every pain, but it does give us courage and strength to deal with them, knowing they are not eternal. Not only that, but Psalm 98 gives us permission and encourages us to express joy with abandon in a

society that admonishes us to be carefully controlled at all times and to protect our "image". Christ has defied the world and its execution and now we are called to do so as well! Let us shout, sing, and rejoice even though it may not seem "appropriate".

If we cannot dare to so rejoice or cannot find the heart to do so in this moment, the Psalm calls on the rest of creation to do so for us. God's creation praises God by doing what it was created to do and being as it was created to be. Let the sea ROAR! Let the floods CLAP! Let the hills SING for joy! Can you hear the *Symphony of Creation* that God has prepared? Do you hear the rejoicing of the wind, birds, water, and bees? Can you find the music in the dog's bark or the cat's meow? Do you hear the beauty in the child's laughter? Creation rejoices! Creation rejoices because the Lord is coming to judge the earth, but God doesn't judge as we judge: God judges with righteousness and equity.

Christ's resurrection is God's judgment on the earth: God has judged the earth to be "loved". Christ has been raised to tell the earth and all that is in it that it is not lost to salvation. Being what we were created to be means participating in the joy of the Easter salvation given to us through the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. No pain, sorrow, or trouble can take that from us. No darkness can stop the praise of God's Creation.

So, I invite you this Easter Season to rejoice and sing for joy, even if for just a moment, even in the midst of the troubles of this life. Celebrate Easter: make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises.

May brings about thoughts of planning summer activities, but also those dreaded outdoor household projects and spring cleaning. Chores may not be tops on the list, but with school work coming to an end, spring is the ideal time to get the entire family involved and chart out the family's chore assignments.

You may be wondering what do chores have to do with helping our children grow in faith. As Christians, we are called to serve and help each other. Teaching your children to help the family as well as others, helps them to develop a heart of service. It also provides the opportunity to teach obedience, humility, and perseverance. And, for parents, we learn how to put our patience into practice! The Bible tells us in Colossians 3:23 to "Work willingly at whatever you do, as though you were working for the Lord rather than for people."

In a 2016 article from *Parenting Christian Kids,* it states that chores help children develop a sense of self-worth and belonging. They also suggest these examples of age-appropriate tasks that your kids can perform:

**Ages 3-5:** Have young children work alongside you to put away toys, place dirty clothes in a hamper, sort laundry, make their beds and feed pets.

**Ages 6-8:** Children can dust and vacuum, put away their clothes, empty wastebaskets, set and clear the table, and help with some yardwork.

**Ages 9-12:** Older kids can load and unload the dishwasher, unpack groceries, mop the floor, fold laundry, wash the car, and help prepare meals.

A helpful tip to get kids to do chores is to focus on teamwork. Designate a time when everyone chips in around the house. For example, do chores at a particular time every Saturday morning. This reinforces the importance of each individual's contributions.

None of us really want to do chores, but they are reality. Our kids will protest and grumble, and we may tire of their complaining, but enlisting the entire family in these tasks benefits all members of the family. Pray for God's guidance and assistance in giving you a positive attitude when encouraging your children to complete their tasks, and ask God to help your children be willing and eager contributors to your family.


This spring, rejoice in what the Lord provides and enjoy the beauty that this season brings!

#### <u>Darkness to Light Child</u> <u>Protection Training Offered</u>

As people of faith, we are called to care for "the least of these" and "the smallest of these." Faith leaders (pastors, council members, Sunday School teachers, youth leaders, parents) and all who are interested in

creating a safer community for our children are invited to a Stewards of Children® training on **Monday, May 8** at **5:00 p.m. at Emmanuel Lutheran** (2901 13<sup>th</sup> St, Menominee). This 2.5 hour program is offered by Pastor Kari Vadis (Trinity, Rhinelander), an Authorized Facilitator, and is approved for 2.5 contact hours of continuing education (2.5 CEUs).

Darkness to Light is a national not-for-profit leader in the prevention of child sexual abuse. Guided by the vision of a world where children can grow up happy, healthy, and safe, Darkness to Light is committed to empowering people to prevent child sexual abuse. They believe that protecting children is an adult's responsibility, and that through education and training, adults will be empowered to act. Stewards of Children® is an evidence-informed, award-winning, two-hour training that teaches adults to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. Through interviews with child sexual abuse survivors, experts, and treatment providers, Stewards of Children® teaches adults practical actions they can take to reduce instances of child sexual abuse in their organizations, families, and communities.

This program is sponsored and supported by the Northern Great Lakes Synod Youth Ministry Team.
