



On Reformation Sunday, October 29<sup>th</sup>, during the 10:00 a.m. worship service, six youth of our church affirmed their baptismal vows.

God the Father is the creator of all things. He made us, not just our bodies, but our soul as well. He teaches us by creating consequences we can see. As a father would punish a child, so too God punishes us when we sin: He gives us a consequence so that we may recognize that what we have done is wrong. He also allows us to make our own mistakes and choices,

so He gave us emotions and free will. To help us learn from our experiences, He gives us the faculties of foresight and intuition.

Jesus is the payment for our sin. He came to Earth both God and man, lived a human life, and died a human death. #### **Christmas Food/Non-Food Drive**

The collection of food and non-food items for the Christmas boxes will take place <u>December 3rd through</u> <u>December 17<sup>th</sup></u>. The donated items will be given to individuals and families in our community who are in

need. This gift will help bring some joy and hope to them at Christmas. Donated goods may be placed in the marked area in the narthex.

**Food items needed:** Canned meats (tuna and chicken), canned dinners, complete meal foods like spaghetti sauce with meat, peanut butter, soups, canned fruits and vegetables, pasta and rice including boxed meals, pancake mixes and syrup, cereal, and juices. <u>Please check expiration dates – we cannot include expired food in the boxes.</u>

**Non-food items needed:** Hand soap, shampoo, paper towels, toilet tissue, dish soap, laundry soap, fabric softener, zip-lock type storage bags of all sizes, and general cleaning and disinfecting supplies. Please note when buying in bulk, items must be individually wrapped.

## Develop a heart of generosity

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances! - 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Would you like to be a more generous person, possessing a generous heart? Then try embracing gratitude as a spiritual practice. Since Thanksgiving is on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of this month, November is a wonderful time to give it a try. Gratitude and generosity go together. Whether you're a millionaire or middle-class, when you are grateful for what you have, you'll likely be happier and more satisfied. You will see the world through eyes of abundance and be more likely to give of yourself. How can we embrace gratitude as a spiritual practice? Paul gives us good advice.

Give thanks in all circumstances: Paul says give thanks IN all circumstances, not FOR all circumstances. In tough times, we can be grateful for what is going well and for the resources, relationships, and faith that will help us through.

Pray without ceasing: Pray in the shower, in your car, on the beach, on your lunch break, at a stop light, in a grocery line. God hears all your prayers. Pray anywhere, anytime.

Rejoice always: Look for everyday celebrations every day. Do you have hot water? A car? Clean socks? Food? Friends? Rejoice!

For a disciplined approach, keep a journal of your daily thanks, or a "gratitude list" that you can pray over and revise. Keep it up and it's a good bet that your developing "attitude of gratitude" will result in you becoming more generous and seeing the world through a lens of abundance.




