Even though the last day of the old year seems to flow similarly into the first day of the new year, the New Year is still a mystery. In our psyches, in our hopes, the beginning of the New Year indeed acts as liminal space. Liminal space is creative space. It is the space of hope and

new possibilities. It is the space of wonderings and fears. New things can blossom in this space. It can be a frightening space because it is unknown—not knowing what will happen is some of what makes us humans most fearful. We do not know what the New Year will hold. It could be good and pleasant or it could be painful and difficult. In actuality, the New Year will hold a mix of both, but in this liminal space we cannot yet see the manifestation of it. At this point, we are uncertain about how to prepare for what the year will hold, so we may pray along with the Psalmist. Give us help when we need it, O God. Grant us your grace in our work. Answer our prayers and grant us the joy of your presence.

I invite you to pray Psalm 20 on this New Year's Eve and New Year's Day. Pray it for yourself. Pray it for your friends and loved ones. Pray it for the strangers in your life. And, if you are brave enough, pray it for your enemies as well and perhaps they will stop being your enemies this year.

Blessings to you always in the name of the One who holds us close in the liminal space.

## **Annual Congregational Meeting**


Sunday, January 28, following worship
