And there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots: <sup>2</sup> And the spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD. (Isaiah 11: 1-2)

#### Dear friends in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

I assume that by the time you read this letter, the feast of All Saints will be behind us, and we will be close to the end of the Church year and the beginning of Advent and Christmas preparations. Christmas and Advent are my favorite times of year. I enjoy their warmth, beauty, and hope.

Advent is a season of waiting—And I must admit that I love this time of year except for the snow. The Christmas decorations, the music, and the diverse cultural aspects of the celebrations all make me happy during this time of year. In my Indian culture, there is a tradition that every Christian house hangs a star outside their houses for Christmas. This is part of Christmas decoration, which identifies us as Christians in the country that is multireligious. Symbolically, the star represents "Jesus as the light of the world."

Many Christian communities throughout India enjoy telling Christmas stories and singing Christmas carols in their dialects. My favorite Christmas memories include attending Midnight Service with family and friends on Christmas Eve and eating the plum cake my mother bakes for us and also for our Hindu neighbors.

This season reminds me of the words of Matthew that we acknowledge at the time of baptism "let your light shine." When we share the light of peace, joy, hope, and love, with people around us, it brings joy to ourselves and glorifies God because it is Jesus' light shining through us. It reminds us that God the Immanuel is with us.

I invite you to join us for Advent devotions beginning on Wednesday, November 29th at 5pm until December 20th. During the service, we will sing some carols and hear about Advent joy, hope, and love. Feel free to bring someone you think might benefit from hearing it as well.



By the time you read this, I will have completed leading a book study through our Lifelong Faith Formation classes on "Embracing Gods Future Without Forgetting the Past: A Conversation about Loss, Greif, and Nostalgia in Congregational Life." It is a sobering read full of truth about what many of our congregations are facing and how grief is being experienced.

The author, former Bishop Michael Girlinghouse, advises that this grief must be processed before our congregation can move forward, and he offers some ideas, workshops, and methods of how to address this grief, no just as individuals but as communities of faith that are collectively experiencing loss and change.

I agree with him that naming the point of pain regarding loss is important. And I believe that we are only just beginning to understand what those points of pain are, as our congregations are at different places in the arc of their life cycles and facing these challenges at different times.

I did suspect when I accepted this call to a second term that the church was going to change more in the next six years then it has in the last twenty. Changes in the last 20-30 years have sort of snuck up on us. But the challenges we thought of then as "someday maybe" have now arrived.

With shifts in culture, with the acceleration of institution decline pushed by COVID, with anxiety increasing, there is gathering momentum to do more to equip lay leaders for the work of ministry.

Of course, the work of ministry has always rested on lay leaders who more often than not are working in partnership with a pastoral leader or keeping ministry in motion during pastoral transition. However, increasingly fewer people are enter seminary. And while it is true that fewer congregations can afford a full-time pastor, even the ones that have the financial capacity must compete with each other for our shrinking pool of pastoral leaders.

Yet, our synod is a great place to serve in ministry! I have observed a respect for the pastoral office and a deep appreciation for that partnership. I see people who love their church and the ministry accomplished combine through their combine efforts, and all of it in community that have a sense of what it means to be neighbor. There is a pride in self-sufficiency: the garden, the homemade, the do-it-yourself kind of attitude. Add to that the beauty of God's creation and we want to ask who wouldn't want to live here?

Unfortunately, as I seek to recruit pastoral leaders, we are an unknown entity. Much as I try to educate, it is the exceptional pastoral candidate that it willing to move to the northern top of the U.S. possibly away from family.

So.... what is the answer to this current challenge?

I appeal to your own sense of pride in the homemade. Look around your congregations. Who has gift for ministry? Who is already leading? We have several lay schools (with NGLS scholarship funds available) ready to equip people for the work they are already doing. Between the Lay school offered at Luther Seminary to the Lay school in our neighboring synods of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin and the East Central Synod of Wisconsin, the tools needed to equip lay leaders for ministry are in reach. I suggested we raise up our own leaders who can then discern if the have a call to ordained ministry (we have scholarship funds for seminary too) or wish to be equipped, educated, and supported for a larger role as a lay leader.

I am grateful to our currently serving Licensed Lay Ministers, and to our lay leaders and congregation members who are such an asset and blessing to the work of Christ. As I continue to recruit pastoral leaders TO our synod, I ask you to do the same IN our synod. Whatever the future brings, I know that the work of Christ will continue.




# Sunday School has started!
