FROM PASTOR CATIE

"I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing."
-Genesis 12:2 (NRSV)

In this text God calls Abram. God tasks him with relocating and doesn't really give a reason why. Abram had to begin again. It begs the question, how did he do it?

Some possible answers are that he was wealthy. He was also called, not forced. Finally, he didn't travel alone.

Hannah Garrity further reflects on this through her artwork. She describes her piece as follows: "In this image, the globe subtly depicts the route that Abram and his wives, his children, his servants, and his animals took. The lines of countries are suggested as they ripple outward. Tools for navigation used to read the stars and the shadows are echoed below the globe. Stars in the corners represent the twelve tribes of Israel. How do we begin again? Through the paper lace, the book of Genesis overlays a canvas. The text is hard to read, clouded by oil paint. How do we begin again? Listen through the haze, through the clouded reality, for God's call. God is calling as we begin again."

As I thought about Abram's new beginning, I thought about what new beginnings look like for us. Although it may not feel like it in the Northwoods, as snow and cold persist, spring begins this month. This is a new beginning for creation as plants begin to bloom and the days grow longer.

I think this is also fitting as we continue our journey to the cross this year. Lent is often used as a time of self-reflection. In what ways is God calling you? Are there places in your life where you can begin again? Genesis 12:2 reminds us that we are blessed and that we can be a blessing to others in creation. This month may we continue to be aware of these blessings and the new beginnings that are happening in and around us.

From the President:

With Ash Wednesday tomorrow to begin the season of Lent we take many looks at our heart. From Solomon we get the advice to "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it". Great advice. During Lent we examine our hearts to see where we are at. Back in World War II there was a Hungarian-born mathematician who lent his great skills to help solve a problem of airplanes being shot down. He looked at the most vulnerable parts of the plane to add armor to in order to strengthen that part of the plane. He realized that it was the engine of the planes, when hit, caused it to go down whereas other parts when hit didn't necessarily cause the plane to crash. If we armor our hearts by heeding His instructions, we'll be better able to "keep our feet from evil" and remain steadfast on our journey with God as Solomon concludes this bit of wisdom from Proverbs. I like this thought. With so many threats out there, we need God's wisdom guarding our hearts so we can stay focused on our mission to live well for God's glory. Many of these ideas are from a daily devotion written by Kirsten Holmberg. I appreciate her insights she is passing on to all of us.

The Church Council continues to work on the business of our congregation. Discussion continues about communion keeping in mind the COVID-19 protocols still necessary. We will revisit this in March, as we do every month, with the hopes of a transition back to more traditional ways of communing.

The Constitution Committee is almost done with their work of revising the Constitution in order to bring it up to date with our Synod and the greater ELCA church. It will then be given to the Church Council for their ideas before it is presented to the standing committee of our Synod that looks at and approves of each congregation's constitution. So that process is continuing with an end in sight.

I encourage you to talk with the members of each Board and hear what exciting work they are about. It is the work of these individual Boards that really runs our congregation. A big thank you is due to all the people who help carry on the very necessary work that is done, many times behind the scenes.

You Can Learn a Lot from a Dog

A daily practice of mine is to walk my dog, Juergen. Juergen is always eager to go for a walk. No surprise there! My wife describes Juergen as "4-Legged Joy with a Tail." I named Juergen after one of my favorite theologians, Juergen Moltmann.

Recently we took a walk in a large pasture area on public land. Fresh snows and ice left the snow deep but very crusty on the top. Juergen was so excited for his walk, but this time he sensed early on that there would be problems. He ran out ahead of me, but he was very much slowed down by the crusty snow breaking way and his legs sinking into the deep snow. It was very difficult for him to "blaze" a new trail on his own.

I felt sorry for Juergen for not having the typical freedom to merely bounce on ahead of me. Eventually, Juergen slowed down. I could tell he was becoming fatigued, and this walking experience was not pleasant at all. I, too, was having difficulty blazing my own trail. I really should have been wearing snowshoes, but with my winter boots I was able to stomp down and create size 13 divots in the deep snow.

What happened next caught my attention. My dog slowed down. He then started following me so that his paws could easily follow in my footprints without him having to break through snow. Even though it slowed him down, Juergen was having a much more enjoyable time following in my clear footprints in the snow. Sometimes when the snow was not so deep, Juergen would leap out ahead of me and make his own trail. Then, when the snow got deep again, Juergen slowed down and started following my footprints.

You can see the obvious spiritual lesson here! Jesus calls us to follow him. Sometimes we bounce out ahead of Jesus with bold confidence that we can handle whatever life has to throw at us. Then we encounter the inevitable deep snow with an icy crust. We fall in. We have to slow down. For a moment we keep trying to blaze our own trail. Finally, if we are humble enough to slow down, we can wait for the Master to pass. We can more efficiently continue our journey following in the big and confident footsteps of the Master, Jesus.

Jesus has gone before us to show us the way. Jesus said, "I am the Way." Thanks be to God that Jesus has the patience to wait upon us when we foolishly bolt out ahead and get hip deep in trouble.

That day my dog taught me a lot about my Lord's loving patience with me and the confident path of Jesus.
