It is hard not to think that, if a little one such as this can find home so easily among these people of God, just maybe there is welcome here for me too.

Of course, there is welcome for you and when it's not perfect or perfectly clear that you are welcomed, we will work at it. We will find ways to better serve you in love, because that is our mission and our call. All are Welcome. We are attempting to shout it from the floor to the ceiling and that's a Narthex fact.
