Summer is a busy time! Many of us head out. Family and Friends come to join us on Lake Michigan. Highway 41 becomes a very well traversed path both north and south.

One important thing to remember is that your faith home at First Lutheran isn't stuck on 1212 Minneapolis Ave. It is meant to be on the move. Wherever you go First goes with you.

So, we have a bit of a summer project planned. Starting June 4, 2023, we will have two maps hanging in the narthex. Next to the maps we will have a folder of dots. Blue dots for visitors and red dots for members.

If you bring a friend to church whether they be from up the street or Washington State encourage them and any visitor to, put their dot on the map. We want to see how far reaching our in-person worship community goes this summer. When you head out, we ask you to take one of the small satchels from the narthex.
