

Stewardship IS ANYBODY OUT THERE?

There's a true story about one of our members in his 90's, who has long since passed away, who questioned God's memory. All his friends had passed away and, because he was still alive, he said, "I wonder if God forgot about me?"

We can be tempted to write this off as a melancholy and a little humorous question. From our perspective, of course, God never forgets us. God ALWAYS remembers us.

As I age, I think more and more about my mortality. My physical and/or cognitive decline has gone from a possibility to a probability, assuming the clock keeps ticking.

More and more of our fellow First Lutheran friends find themselves homebound, in nursing homes or assisted living facilities and rehab. Those of us in the Silent Generation or Boomers are getting separated from family and friends as we deal with any number of disabilities or are in a caregiver role. Depending upon the level of support we have around us, it's easy to imagine how one can feel forgotten. Transitioning to somewhere away from the familiar, especially with little or no support, can be scary and depressing.

As time goes on, "out of sight, out of mind" can set in. We can even imagine how one could feel that even God has forgotten them.

In spite of this "downer" scenario, there is GOOD NEWS and a really happy ending. God loves us and remembers us as God's precious children-each and every one of us. God loves and works through us and that's our cue to be faithful stewards.

We need to continue to look for ways we can show God's love by reaching out to those who may feel isolated and abandoned AND to those who are caregivers. It may be as simple as a call, a note, a visit, a touch and, above all, PRAYER. When all else fails, pray for those who may feel that God has forgotten them.

Borrowing from the September 25 Christ in Our Home devotional, "When loss or illness comes into our lives, we can easily doubt whether God remembers us at all". We need to trust that God is always present and sometimes all we can do is to be present, as well.
