Paschal Greeting/Easter Acclamation

Pastor: Alleluia! Christ is risen. Congregation: Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

FLC Family,

Each Easter, we use the Paschal Greeting (Paschal means relating to Passover or Easter). Jesus is our Paschal lamb. Paul called Jesus the Paschal lamb in 1 Corinthians 5:7. He saw the parallels to Passover in the sacrifice made by Jesus on the cross. Christ's death freed us from the bond of sin.

Easter Acclamation is another great way to discuss this greeting. We honor this time with a special and ancient greeting from the biblical language of the Synoptic Gospels.
