Dear FLC Family,

What's in a name? At First Lutheran Church, we talk a great deal about being named and claimed as children of God. It's also crucial for us to remember how important it is for God to be "named". This month, we will hear from John 17. In this chapter, Jesus prayers to God the Father. He reminds God that God's name has been shared with God's people. Then he askes for those people to be protected in the name God gave to Jesus.

Naming God in our lives and our faith walks matters. To say out loud, "I thank God for this sunrise...Thank you, Jesus, for this cardamom bread...Holy Spirit surround my neighbor who always bring me the paper..." This naming is part of how we live our prayers. It makes the holy relationship tangible.

When Wesley and I were on one of our very early dates, he introduced me by saying, "This is my girlfriend, Elisabeth." It was too soon for that! It should have been a red flag. Instead, it was flattering and refreshing. I appreciated the clarity and his straightforwardness. His declaration and "naming" me in this way was more than endearing. Apparently, after that, I was all in!

God longs for us to be all in by saying it out loud; boldly naming and claiming our Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Like Thomas, who is known for doubting, it is vital for us to have "My Lord and My God! Moments even in our doubt. The month of May in the Upper Peninsula is when the natural world around us begins to reawaken. God is easy to name in the blooming flowers and majestic lakeshore. What about when it's more challenging?

Name God. In Genesis 16, Hagar, the concubine of Abraham, a slave, names God. In her suffering. God sees her and supports her, so she names God, saying, "You are El-roi (meaning "The God who sees me."), she said, "Have I realy seen God and remained alive after seeing him?" (Gen 16:13) She did, and from her came a great nation. Our name, above all names, seeks to claim us. Let's honor that bond by proclaiming it.
