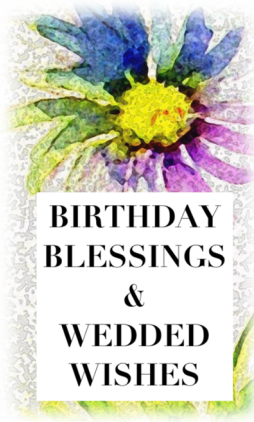

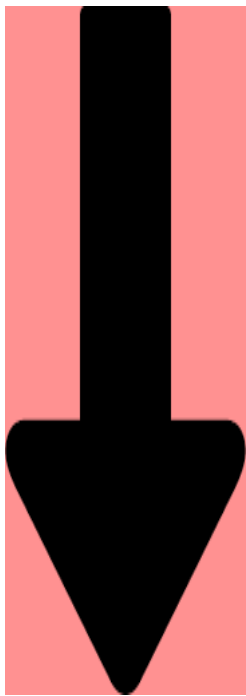

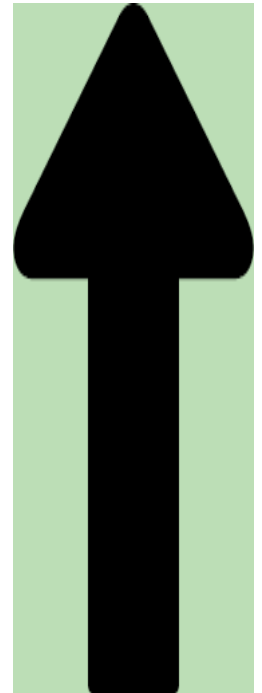

Now, read it from bottom to top, the other way, and see how you really feel about your day.

Chanie Gorkin (now 25) wrote this poem at the age of 16. A student at the all-girls Beth Rivkah High School in Brooklyn, Chanie is an Orthodox Jew, affiliated with the Lubavitch branch of Hassidic Judaism. Her poem, she's explained, reflects the Jewish idea that it's possible to control how we see the world, whether negatively or positively: **"I don't think there is such a thing as the worst day ever... I wanted to show how your day is really based on how you look at things."**

The **God** who promises us new mercies each morning is the same God who sits with us in the pits of despair. The **Savior** whose first miracle enlivened a wedding party in peril is the same Savior who had nails driven through his wrists. The **Spirit** who comes into our hearts upon prayer is the same Spirit who blows as the Spirit sees fit. While we are all accompanied by our God, our Savior, our Savior, it IS up to us to view the world in a negative or positive light. **How will YOU read YOUR day today?**
