Fixing Road Signs on Highway 41

Dear Church,

Recently, while driving up and down Highway 41, I saw a church sign with this exact wording on it: **GOD BLESSES THOSE WHO WORK FOR IT**. Well, I'll be honest: I had to really focus on *NOT* driving directly INTO that sign! **ARGH**!

I was disturbed that such a statement would be attributed to God, and by a church, no less! Let me see if I can break down my **frustration**:



WORK FOR IT: I think this is the best place to start, because it's probably the most **offensive** part of the sign. Work for it? That's a hard **NO**. I seem to recall Paul writing to the Ephesians (2:8) about how we are saved *NOT* by our works, but by the **GRACE** of God. **GRACE**. Not <u>our</u> efforts, not <u>our</u> hard work, nor <u>our</u> sheer determination, or even by <u>our</u> output. **GOD's GRACE** and GRACE alone allows us to be showered with God's blessings.

Paul goes on to say to the people of Corinth (1 Cor 15:10) that we are **WHO** we are by the sheer **GIFT** of grace - meaning those blessings that **DO** fall upon us are just that: **gifts**. NOT rewards because we "worked for it." (*Argh! See my frustration!?*)

And just what kind of "**work**" must we do in order to "earn" these blessings?!? We have been commanded to love one another, so that's not work - that's **duty**. We have been commanded to care for our neighbors, so that's not work - that's **compassion**.

Another worrisome part of this sign is the **converse** of what happens to those who, for one reason or another, **DON'T** "work for it." Does that mean they lead a life *WITHOUT* God's blessings? What a horribly sad thought, and a terribly judgmental one, at that.



Instead of being frustrated at a sign I cannot change, I'm simply posting one of my own, right here: **GOD BLESSES GOD'S BELOVED CHILDREN.** <u>NOT</u> because of the "work" you might do - God's blessings are not a <u>contest</u> to be won. But rather, because we are **LOVED** by a God who created us, promises to be **WITH** us, and One who sustains and cherishes Pr. Butward each and every one of us! **AMEN**!

Synod Assembly Recap

Dear Northern Great Lakes Synod: Grace and peace to you! Just a [month ago], we gathered as a Synod at Northern Michigan University in Marquette, MI. Here is a brief recap with highlights and actions taken:

WORSHIP SERVICES

- **Thursday**: The assembly began with a Spirit-filled Opening Worship. Using the space at NMU, we used two ballrooms to accommodate a bell choir, a vocal choir, a pastor band, vested clergy, deacons, and LLM's, a children's worship play space, and many NGLS voting members and guests gathered as Church to worship. We used gluten free bread for all, compliments of baker and retired pastor, Rev. Dave Van Kley. A video of that service is available at https://bit.ly/SA23Open.

ELECTION INFORMATION



- Friday morning, I was honored to be granted a second six-year term to serve as the **Bishop** of this synod. I am sincerely grateful for your affirmation and this chance to continue this journey of being Church together.
- Question Raised: **How can I abstain?** There was some conversation about adding an "abstention" option to the electronic ballot. A reluctance was expressed that voters may not want to vote for someone they did not know. Since it is unlikely that in a synod of 20,000 people that we will all know each other, the process provides a brief description of those nominated with a paragraph offering insight into why the person accepts the nomination. It is the responsibility of voting members to review these paragraphs, included in the Pre-Assembly Report, prior to the assembly. This provides all nominees equal space for expression for voters to consider them.
- **CHAPLAINS:** Throughout the assembly, Chaplains serving in our Synod offered prayers and briefly described their area of service. We are grateful for the efforts of:
 - o Rev. David Murphy Naval Reserve Chaplain
 - Rev. Peter Vorhes Michigan State Police Chaplain
 - Rev. Keith Kolstad Chaplain at Northland Luth. Retirement Community
 - o Deacon-elect Jen Elsenbroek Chaplain at Great Lakes Recovery

RESOLUTIONS OF NOTE

• Given our changed financial reality and the desire for funding for Synod ministry projects, we voted to **rescind** a 2017 Resolution that established a policy that any funds in excess of \$150,000 be sent on to our Churchwide partners.



- At Synod Assembly 2023, 31.3% of the voting members were clergy. This is well within the parameters
 required by our constitution that at least 60% of voting members be of the laity. However, the time
 may come in the future when the combined voting members of retired and serving clergy exceeds
- 40%. A resolution was **passed** to ensure the constitution requirement of at least 60% lay voting members at future synod assemblies. Know that for the foreseeable future, the 20 25 or so retired clergy who register will receive both voice and vote.
- We passed a **deficit budget**, and approved the Clergy Compensation Guidelines for **2024**.



OTHER HIGHLIGHTS

- **216** voting members registered along with **50** or so visitors.
- Our first **Seed Sower** Lunch, thanking those who have made a planned gift or who are interested.
- Display Tables w/ tons of info, Pr Doug Norquist on piano. Robust + harmonic congregational singing.
- Synod Ministry and Partnership Reports: LSS, Youth Ministry, Stewardship Committee, Lifelong Faith Formation, Candidacy, Endowment ministry, Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp, Faithful Innovations, Portico, Christ's Kaleidoscope, etc.
- Table conversations and Conference sessions! Pre-assembly workshops! Prayfaithfully Devotions!
- Friday night banquet honoring ordination and congregation anniversaries and retirements. Entertainer Troy Graham who loved that we sang along to the gospel tunes.




