A WORD FROM BISHOP ALEX MALASUSA

Dar es Salaam, Tanzania December 8, 2014

It is my privilege this evening to offer a few reflections about Bishop Skrenes and his team. It is an honor to say a ew words on this day of thanksgiving. A day to thank ervants of the Living God for giving their life to Jesus and by loing so sharing their life with us. As we gather with you 3ishop Skrenes, together with Pastor David Hueter, Pastor D.J. Rasner and Pastor Christopher Johnson, it is my joy and

privilege to address you. After all the joy, excitement and ntensity of these days of your most historic visit, we now therish this moment of prayerful reflection with you.

During our general assembly you blessed us by the powerfu preaching. You were bold enough to speak about how to pread the good news of Jesus Christ in all seasons. Time and again, you have spoken of the importance of the contribution of the Christian faith in our society. We can already sense a new openness to this question, and to the ole of faith communities, in the hearts and willingness of sc nany people.
