# Pastor's Reflections ...

You may have noted in last month's newsletter that I am beginning to work with a team to plan a sabbatical leave for 2019. The La Crosse Area Synod encourages pastors to make use of a "sabbatical leave" as a time for renewal and refocusing. The pastor steps back from parish work, usually for about three months. The pastor returns to continue the ministry, but with some new energy, and maybe some new insights and perspectives.



For Pastor Jean and myself, the sabbatical leave is part of the call package, and over the years the congregation has set aside some funds to make the sabbatical happen. My plan is to take my sabbatical (my first in my 32 years of ministry) in summer of 2019, returning in September. Pastor Jean will continue the ministry here, but with some assistance, such as occasional pulpit supply. She would then look at her own sabbatical a year or two later.

What really makes this exciting, however, is that we are in the process of applying for a grant from the Lily Foundation. The Lily Foundation provides grants to pastors who are taking a sabbatical leave, encouraging them to do what "makes your heart sing." Or, in other words, what will refresh and renew?

The Lily grant would provide the resources for the sabbatical to really "take flight," and do some fun stuff. We are working on it, and I'm hoping that it will happen for us.

But wait, there's more! The Lily grant is not just for me. A portion of the grant is for the congregation, to do two things – first, to assist with some of the costs for covering my absence, though with the sabbatical being over the summer, and Pastor Jean present, those costs shouldn't be too great.

More importantly, the grant is also designed to provide resources for the congregation to do some fun things related to the sabbatical. What fun things? That's one of the things which my sabbatical team is developing – a proposal for how the congregation would, in a sense, accompany me on the sabbatical. We would find out if we get the grant sometime in August.

So, what's the sabbatical going to be about? I want to explore cultural heritage. I'm German, but I grew up in "melting pot" suburbia. I don't speak German, we ate a variety of foods growing up (like all those German delicacies, you know – spaghetti, pizza, chow mein...), and I really don't know a lot about German culture. I want to learn more about it – about who I am. Part of the sabbatical, the part that happens whether or not we get the grant, is to travel to Germany in June of 2019.

But there are other cultures that are important to me. Rebecca is from Russia, and I have a foster-brother (who spent 15+ years in our family), who is part Alaskan Indian. I want to learn about those too. They also contribute to who I am. The grant would give me that opportunity.

And then there are other cultures – ones that are not me, but are an important part of the world around us. Like African American, Chinese American, and yes, even Norwegian! Taking some time during the

sabbatical, I would learn more about these cultures, and what they contribute to our American experience. And I would do so by some study, and even, yes, some fun!

Why is all this important? Because we live in a world that is rapidly changing, even right here in West Salem. We aren't all Scandinavian or even Northern European anymore!

Yet, at the same time, there seems to be increasing tension between peoples in our world. More and more we are polarized. Maybe by learning more about others, so that I don't just tolerate, but even embrace those who are different, we might just begin to more fully appreciate the gift that God gives us in the cultures around us.

That is what the sabbatical team will look at for Our Savior's. How can we come to embrace new cultural expressions, while at the same time more deeply understanding our own, all in the midst of a changing world?

And how can we do that by learning and by having a bit of fun?

So keep watching for more details. If we get the grant, hey – cool stuff will happen! And if we don't get it, hey – cool stuff will happen!

Either way, we celebrate and give thanks. God's gifts abound!


## SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS



# Stewardship a way of life

## **Stewardship Corner**

As this newsletter is being prepared, we are in the process of sending out checks to the recipients of last year's college scholarships. Six college freshman are receiving scholarships ranging from \$350 to \$700, while one sophomore received a scholarship last September for \$700. What a great gift to encourage our young people as they nurture and develop the abilities that God gave to them. And that is stewardship – theirs to learn, ours to support them!

And soon, we will be encouraging this year's high school seniors to apply for a scholarship. Thanks to the Marking and Michelson Families, to gifts given in memory of David Lewis and Fred Meyer, and to the Pipers, for supporting last year's scholarships.

And don't forget about the Homer Moe Scholarship for non-traditional students. Two have received that scholarship in the past few years. Good stewardship all the way around!

But wait, there's more! At the end of each semester we send, to those college students of any year, for whom we have an address, a small gift – a card and a gift card (Subway or Kwik Trip). We want them to know that during finals, as they are studying hard, we are remembering them and supporting them. Again, our stewardship...encouraging their stewardship. So make sure we have college student's addresses – get them to Pastor Jean.

And one final note – students aren't the only ones learning. You really can teach an old dog new tricks. So be a good steward. Support those who are learning, but make sure you are also one of the "learners" – wherever you are in life!

## **Using Savings Bonds Creatively**

U.S. Savings Bonds can be a great vehicle for savings, but can also be used creatively to support the work of Jesus in our world. How so? By funding a life income gift such as a gift annuity.

When U.S. bonds are cashed the recipient pays ordinary taxes on the gain in the bonds, which is why so

many are never cashed in by seniors. However, by cashing bonds and using the funds to enter an ELCA gift annuity, seniors can use the charitable deduction obtained from the gift annuity to help offset the income taxes from the savings bonds. The best part is that they will then obtain a partly tax free income for life, and the net result may be far better than if they simply cashed the bonds. If you have U.S. Bonds, consider whether the cash from them may be used to make a gift that returns a life income for you.


