Behold I make all things new

(Rev. 21:1-6)

In his final sermon before going on sabbatical, Pastor Jon preached on these words from Revelation. Jesus says "behold I make all things new." Pastor Jon told Briella, who was baptized at 8 AM that morning, that in the waters of baptism, Jesus promises new life for her. He told the graduating seniors at the 10:30 AM service, that God has great plans for them as they step out in the world to new adventures, new experiences. The alpha and omega, the beginning and the end – *Jesus* – holds them (and all of us) in his embrace, surrounding them with the love that brings new life.

For Pastor Jon, he awaits what is new. In 33 years of ministry he has not had a sabbatical, a time of rest and renewal. This will be a new experience, and I'm not sure if it's one he looks forward to or not. He already has his days structured and planned; the list of things to accomplish and to do is lengthy. Someone made the observation that being a pastor is what Pastor Jon knows how to be; for so long he has had the responsibility for others, caring for them, nurturing them, providing support, preaching, teaching, visiting, and sharing the sacraments. This has been his Calling and you don't just turn that off. It takes work to relax. But Jesus says, "behold I make all things new." In Pastor Jon's sermon he noted that if we try to live in the past, "the good old days", we don't trust Jesus' words that he makes all things new. But that is hard, very hard ... to let go of our control and spread our wings, taking flight and soaring where God calls us and where God leads us. So, Pastor Jon, we will look forward to seeing what Jesus makes new in you, as you let go and soar, allowing yourself to be refreshed and renewed.

Holding down the fort here at church will be a bit new for me. I had my own congregation before and I did just fine, but I

also had the support and wisdom of my husband. When challenges and obstacles crept up, I didn't have to tackle them alone. Not being able to talk through things with my partner at the dinner table will be new, but I will have the support and help of a group of talented staff, leaders, and a faithful congregation. Things may not always get done the way they're supposed to, the way they used to be in "the good old days." But they will get done ... Jesus makes all things new ... and we trust his words! Besides ... it's only three months ... how badly can I mess things up?

There is a sense of adventure when you think about doing something new. There is also some apprehension about stepping outside of your comfort zone and doing something new. So we, too, must take to heart the words of the sermon – we must trust Jesus' words that he makes all things new and he will be with us on this journey.

As Briella goes forth, as the graduates go forth, as Pastor Jon goes forth, as we go forth here in this place, and as you go forth in your everyday lives ... remember ... Jesus says "I make all things new" ... trust his words and his presence and go forth boldly!

Sunday School Offering – God's Global Barnyard


As of May 5th, the "friendly competition" between our classes was complete and we celebrated that we met and surpassed our goal of

Hungry Jar Offering for July - New Horizons

New Horizons Shelter and Outreach Centers, a shelter for individuals and families who have experienced domestic violence, was organized in 1978 through the cooperative efforts of an informal group of citizens in the La Crosse area who recognized the need for services to victims of domestic abuse. New Horizons Shelter is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year to provide emergency shelter and food to victims of domestic violence and their children. The shelter's Crisis Advocates provide support and advocacy for women and children throughout their shelter stay. Often, when women come into the shelter, they are forced to flee their homes quickly and under great stress, leaving most of their belongings behind. Through community donations, New Horizons is able to provide families with clothing and personal care items. We thank you for your support and care for those who are hurting.



Our Savior's Mission in the World

God's Work...Our Hands... Mission Endowment Fund

Another in a series of ministries in which we are engaged as part of our faithful stewardship and discipleship.

The Mission Endowment Fund ministry of Our Savior's isn't all that old – established in 2002, it hasn't even seen two decades. Yet, in that time...great things have happened!

The Mission Endowment Fund receives all gifts designated to it, along with 70% of undesignated gifts and bequests. Currently the principal in the fund is close to \$400,000. Only the earnings are distributed yearly. In 2018 that amount was over \$13,000 – and over the lifetime of the fund, over \$170,000 has been distributed.

And where does all that go? To a variety of ministries and human service programs locally and globally! A small portion of the distribution (20%) is held for capital improvements, but the balance all goes forth to make a difference – a LOT of difference – around the world! From children's ministries to the needs of the hungry and homeless, to addiction and education outreach, the distributions impact real people struggling with real needs. God is at work through our endowment fund dollars!

The endowment fund is managed by a five member committee, elected by the congregation. The funds are held in the ELCA Endowment Pooled Trust. The committee is charged with making the distributions, and each year seeks input from the congregation as to worthy recipients. Though there are some restrictions, most local or global ministries and human service programs will qualify.

We are grateful to those who have left bequests to make this fund happen. And we thank you for your support of the ministry of this congregation which allows the Mission Endowment Fund to be a difference maker in our world!

The Congregation Council met on May 13, with President Lynette Ender presiding. At this meeting, the council:

• Began with devotions and prayer.

- Received and approved the minutes from the April meeting, and received and reviewed the financial reports and pastoral reports from April.
- Heard an update on Pastor Jon's sabbatical plans.
- Received updates on Forward: Fearless and Faithful and electronic giving options.
- Discussed the Stewardship for All Seasons (SAS) initiative and decided to engage in SAS.
- Discussed the resignation of Cat Bottem, Youth Director, and heard that Pastor Jon will meet with a group to begin a conversation about future youth ministry directions.
- Heard that a review has taken place of financial practices by the Audit Committee, and that the committee has met with Ty Tlustoch to consider the best approach for audit work.
- Discussed the situation with the tenant in the house at 345
 Leonard St. As the rental is a month-to-month rental, voted
 to end the rental arrangement as of June 30. Directed
 Pastor Jon to communicate this to him both by e-mail and
 certified mail, and to remind him that rents are still due.
- Received into membership the following:
