Pastor's Reflections

Lenten Journey

Well, here we are, another March, another Lenten season. I wonder what this one will bring. Lent of 2020 barely got

started and then it stopped. (Well, Lent didn't stop, but we all did.) Lent of 2021 came and went with no fanfare. Enter Lent 2022 ... we are cautiously optimistic that we will finally be able to walk this journey together, in the same space.

We are beginning to take steps towards moving forward, living into our new normal. Not going back, but going forward. Isn't there an old adage that says 'you can never go back'? We need to go forward. We can take what we knew, we can use what was comfortable, and we can learn from it all ... as we go forward ... but we can't go back.

And, maybe Lent is the perfect time to be doing all of this. Lent is the time we take a pause, it's a time for reflection and introspection. It is a time of quiet.

Lent has traditionally been a time when we give something up. As a child growing up, my Catholic



friends would give up sweets for Lent, and they would never be able to have cake at my birthday party. When you stop to think about the things that are usually given up at this time, they aren't really things that cause us "pain", they aren't much of a sacrifice, we aren't digging deeply, they are things that we don't really miss – like sweets. If Lent is the time we are supposed to give things up, to make sacrifices, it's rather ironic that as we enter this Lent there is a lot of focus in our world on our own wants and desires. We're tired of doing things for the sake of someone else.

Earlier today (as I write this) I gathered virtually with my colleagues in the La Crosse Area Synod to ponder our world and our journey together, as a synod. We talked about how lots of people are tired, almost traumatized by the past two

years, and just want to go their own way. Human nature, I suppose, but we also pondered what it is to be a synod ... and to be the people of God. The word "synod" literally means "walking together" and in our baptism we are, all of us, together in the Body of Christ. And the Body of Christ ... walks together!



That got me thinking about Lent and walking together. We walk together with Jesus on the way to the cross, as he prepares to make the ultimate sacrifice for us. And presumably we walk with each other, putting aside our selfish ways for the sake of others.


I have spent the last couple of weeks glued to the TV watching the Olympics. I love watching all of the sports, but there is more to it than that. The Olympics is a time when the turmoil, chaos, and challenges of the world are put on "pause" for the sake of the athletes, who come together, who walk together, supporting each other, cheering for each other, caring for each other despite the competition, despite their differences.

It's too bad the Olympics have to end; it's too bad Lent has to end – if we can figure out a way to work together, to walk together, and care for each other for a couple of weeks, why can't we figure out a way to do it the rest of the year, too?

On the other hand, when Lent ends, it ends at the foot of the cross, and then at the entrance to the empty tomb. Not a bad place to end!

So, as we go forward, embarking on our Lenten journey, heading to the cross and the empty tomb, remember we don't walk alone. We walk with Jesus. And as we walk with Jesus, may we walk together, and may our actions and our words reflect the sacrifice we are asked to make for the sake of each other.

A Lenten Challenge for our Families ...



A Season of Hope – Lutheran World Relief

Lent is a time for reflection, but it can also be a time of

action. Around the world, our neighbors are suffering in the aftermath of war, displacement and poverty. A Personal Care Kit contains simple, yet life-saving items that help families maintain good hygiene, health and basic human dignity.

We are inviting our families to assemble **Personal Care Kits** during Lent – maybe even more than one! The list of items needed and the instructions for assembling the kits follows on page 13. What a great project to do together with your children – from shopping to assembling!

Kits need to be returned to church **by the end of March**. Financial assistance is always welcome, too, to help ship the items to LWR.

To learn more about this important ministry, check out a new YouTube (https://youtu.be/978eLqj_Tzs) that highlights staff from around the world describing the challenges they face in their work and the ways they witness hope breaking through.



INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

- ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*
- ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging
- ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging
- * Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

HOW TO PACK YOUR PROJECT PROMISE KITS

- Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.
- Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use.
- Bath towels vary in size. The 52" X 27" size listed in the guidelines is the maximum size. 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size.
- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- All items should be new and in good condition.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.
