Pastor's Reflections



I am frustrated! It's time for my pastor's page, and I'm at a loss for what to share. And that frustrates me...and quite frankly, it's driving me a bit crazy!

This has happened before. What to write, what to share, what's important and timely enough. But not like this. This is different.



We are on the verge of Holy Week and Easter. This is the ultimate, the "kairos" moment, the most significant moment, not just for the church, but really, for all of human kind. No other moment in human history is as important and decisive as this one.

We celebrate in the coming weeks God's ultimate work to redeem and restore creation. All the brokenness, vulnerability, and failure is placed on the crucified Jesus. And then, in his resurrection, God breaks the power of sin, death, and evil. And we have life.

Big, big stuff!

And then, as we think (and hope and pray) that Covid is finally waning a bit, we are ready for this moment. What

timing! Things are getting better; Holy Week and Easter are on the horizon. You might even think God had something to do with this...



Yes, the resurrection is upon us!

But not so fast. Hold on a moment. Covid isn't gone, a new variant is loose in Europe, and may be already here, and

then... Ukraine! Easter is supposed to be bright and sunny, with joy and wonder, and lots of good news. And instead...I'm not so sure. And quite frankly, as I write this (last week of March), I wonder what will things be like come Easter (mid-April).


Ugh...so what to write? What can I possibly say?

On the other hand, in a sense, it's a bit of a "been there, done that" for me. Once upon a time I had an Easter kind of like this.

Two days before Palm Sunday, 1997, my father died. That took the wind out of Holy Week, and clouded my Easter. The awe of walking the path to the cross, and then the joy of discovery on Easter morning, just didn't happen. Not the way I wanted, and not the way I planned. Just a lot of gloom, doom, and emptiness.

But surprise – Good Friday, with the crucified Christ, and Easter with the risen Lord, still happened. Despite my emptiness and the distractions of the week, God still acted in Jesus' death and resurrection.

Or maybe not despite, but instead, *because* of my emptiness and distractions, God acted! That is to say, the emptiness, gloom and doom, the uncertainties, the



distractions, and everything else that seems to detract from Easter are, in fact, the very point. Holy Week and Easter are not about bright, sunny days, where all is again good. The resurrection is not the moment when all the bad stuff is gone. Holy Week and Easter are instead about God's work in the midst of difficult, overwhelming, even dark days. Which brings me back to my dilemma – just what do I say when we desperately seek resurrection, new life, new hope, and a new dawn, and all seems to be...not!



Perhaps what I say is... just simply the story. The story that in the cross, Jesus takes our brokenness, and in the resurrection, Jesus overcomes all that overwhelms us. Simple, and to the point.

Someone once said that for a preacher the biggest challenge at a moment like Good Friday and Easter is not to say the

right things, but rather to be careful not to say too much! That is to say, sometimes the best thing I can do is get out of the way and let the story speak. Let God's word run wild among us!

That's a sobering thought, as I am preaching this Easter. And yes, there will be a sermon. But the point is well taken. I don't know what to say (remember?). Yet, what I say is not nearly as what God is doing in Jesus, even in the midst of days like these.

And perhaps for all of us, the gift of Easter is not a glorious resurrection, a bright, shiny day when we can put behind us all the troubles of our world. Instead, the gift of Easter (and the Holy Week that precedes it) is that even in the midst of "gloom and doom," there is still life. Life where there appears to be none.

Not just because of Covid or Ukraine. Those crises will pass. Someday they will be chapters in a history book, and new crises will take their place. New crises that challenge a world, or just new crises that challenge us. Regardless, even then, there will be a crucified Christ, a risen Jesus, and life where we would never expect to see it! So, here's my invitation to you. Come to worship this year. Not because all is now well, the masks are dropped, and some sense of "normal" has returned.



Come to worship because no matter what is happening in the world, across the globe, or in the world, in your little corner, God is still at work, and God is still bringing life. Emptiness, gloom and doom, aside, there is life, and in God's hands, abundant life!

We will celebrate that life this year as we always do, but we will celebrate knowing that life is still sometimes more than we can handle. But never more than God, through the crucified Christ and risen Jesus, can handle.

And there it is, finally, my pastor's page. Just had to stick to the story. And let God do the rest!

Good Friday 1:30 PM


Were you there? We are...at the foot of the cross, to ponder the awesome grace of God in the crucified Jesus!

Thanks to the generosity of several families, Our Savior's has several scholarships to offer to high school seniors for the next academic year.



Personal Care Kits deadline extended ...



A Season of Hope – Lutheran World Relief

Around the world, our neighbors are suffering in

the aftermath of war, displacement, and poverty. A Personal Care Kit contains simple, yet life-saving items that help families maintain good hygiene, health and basic human dignity.

We are inviting our families to assemble **Personal Care Kits** – maybe even more than one! The list of items needed and the instructions for assembling the kits follows on page ??. What a great project to do together with your children – from shopping to assembling!

Kits need to be returned to church **by the end of April** (note **deadline extension**). Financial assistance is always welcome, too, to help ship the items to LWR.

To learn more about this important ministry, check out a new YouTube (https://youtu.be/978eLqj_Tzs) that highlights staff from around the world describing the challenges they face in their work and the ways they witness hope breaking through.



INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

- ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*
- ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging
- ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

* Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

HOW TO PACK YOUR PROJECT PROMISE KITS

• Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.

• Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

• Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use.

• Bath towels vary in size. The 52" X 27" size listed in the guidelines is the maximum size. 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size.

- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.

• Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.

- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- All items should be new and in good condition.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

Covid Protocols

The Congregation Council continues to monitor the



pandemic level in our community, and consider the protocols for safe living. As the infection and hospitalization rates have dropped significantly, the council has determined that we can – and should – gradually relax protocols and move toward a more "normal" church life. These changes include:

- Masks are no longer required, but if you feel safer with a mask, *please continue to wear it!*
- Sign in for contact tracing is no longer used, but we are returning to the use of pew pads (instead of Communion cards), so please use them.
- Pews are no longer taped off. You may choose to sit distanced, and if others prefer to be distanced, please respect that.
- Drinking fountains are now "open for business."

In the coming weeks, other protocols will be relaxed. We hope that for Easter we can return to a more "robust" worship, with additional music.

And then...watch the May newsletter – our hope is to be fully back on May 7/8, with the SOS Band leading our worship.

We are thankful to all of you for your patience and understanding as we have navigated over two years of challenges. Your support has enabled us to meet the diverse needs of the congregation, and more importantly, of the community around us.

Please note, however, that the pandemic remains, and if conditions require, we may need to resume some of the safety protocols. For now, however, we celebrate our time together!
