## Pastor's Reflections

### Gifted and Called ...

The days of February ... Valentine's Day ... Presidents' Day ... and this year, Ash Wednesday.

This February, I would invite you to also think about Our Savior's' third Guiding Principle ... *God gifts and calls every one of every age to be a difference maker in the world.*

Way back in 2022 (yes, that long ago!), the Congregation Council developed a series of "guiding principles," words that declare who and what we are – sort of our "DNA" as a congregation. Each month we are taking a look at another "guiding principle." And this month, it's number three!

On Valentine's Day we are called to share love. Not just love in the candy hearts, chocolate kisses, flowers, diamonds, and romance. That doesn't work for everyone. There are those who are hurting, lonely, broken. They, too, need love, but not "lovey-dovey" love, they need the love of Jesus ... and we [every one of every age] are called to share that love of Jesus ... not just on Valentine's Day, but always.

On President's Day as we celebrate two leaders who worked to make our country strong, who worked to make changes, to ensure all were treated fairly and equally, we [every one of every age] are called to do the same, using Jesus as our guide and role model. Jesus calls us to be welcoming and inviting, to care for all of his people regardless of the color of their skin, their gender identity, their political affiliation, their economic status, their address, their religious beliefs. He calls us to speak out, to advocate, to work for fairness and equality for all.

On Ash Wednesday Jesus begins the journey to the cross and we are invited to join him. We are marked with the cross

of Christ in ashes on our forehead to remind us that we are ‘dust and to dust we shall return’. We [every one of every age] are called into a time of reflection and repentance; a time to look deep within ourselves and make changes.

In the waters of baptism, we [every one of every age] are marked with the cross of Christ forever. In those waters we [every one of every age] are claimed as God’s own, *gifted and called to be a difference maker in the world.*

Did you catch it? “Each and every one...” That’s all of us!

What are you being called to do to make a difference in the world?

What are you being called to do to make a difference here in this place?



The first of our Guiding Principles get us started on our way, and we’ll build on that as we continue to introduce the rest of them in the months to come.

1. **Jesus is Lord and Savior** – all that we do is grounded in Jesus our Lord and Savior ... what else can I say?!
2. **We welcome everyone, and we mean it** – our hearts and minds are open, we are intentional about embracing and including anyone and everyone who comes through our doors.
3. **God gifts and calls every one of every age to be a difference maker in the world** – each and every one of us, no matter how young or how old, has been gifted with the tools and abilities by God to go out and make a difference no matter how small or how big.

Each and every one ... each of us has gifts to share. Not the same gifts, but gifts which together make the whole.

And not only that, we are called to use those gifts to be difference makers ... in here (the church), yes (worship, education, for example) ... but especially out there – out in the world – because, we are not called by God to stay put.

Instead, we are called to be out in the world, using our gifts to make a difference and change lives ... out there. Sometimes that happens in “churchy” things out in the world. Like reaching out through the food pantry, world hunger appeal, quilting, and more.

And sometimes that happens in the routine of our daily lives as we serve others as teachers, health care workers, store employees, service personnel, and more. Ordinary work serving others.

And sometimes that happens when we see the needs around us and respond – the supporting word, helping someone in a moment of need, responding to a crisis (regardless of the size).

What matters is that we know that we are, in some fashion, doing God’s work with our hands.

Making a difference, wherever, no matter how small or how big. That’s our “DNA!”

# **Hungry Jar Offering for February – Sleep in Heavenly Peace**



**NO KID SLEEPS  
ON THE FLOOR  
IN OUR TOWN!**

Across the US, too many kids go without a bed—or even a pillow—to sleep on. These children end up sleeping on couches, blankets, and even floors, which has adverse effects on their physical and mental health. All children deserve a safe, comfortable place to lay their heads. Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) is a national organization with local chapters – one right here in LaCrosse. They are a group of volunteers dedicated to building, assembling and delivering top-notch bunk beds free of charge to children and families in need.

Each bed that SHP delivers to a child sleeping on the floor offers comfort and safety. Oftentimes, the kids who get their beds have never owned a bed of their own. Every kid deserves a good night's rest. \$250 will sponsor a bed and mattress, along with a pillow, sheet set, and comforter. Our gifts make sure kiddos have a comfy place to lay their heads at night.

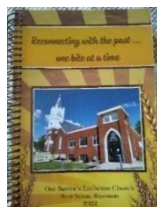

# Annual Meeting



The 2023 Annual Meeting met on Sunday, January 29, with President Jen Linse presiding. Thirty-three voting members were in attendance as the gathered congregation:

- Joined in opening devotions led by Pastor Jean.
- Saw a video greeting from Bishop Felix Malpica of the La Crosse Area Synod.
- Received reports from the pastors, president, and ministries for 2022, along with financial reports.
- Elected the following persons to positions of leadership:
  - Congregation Council: Jaime Fortier, Carolyn Karl, Bonnie Gensch, Chad Vick
  - Mission Endowment Fund: Katie Drury, Scott Thompson
  - Synod Assembly voting member: Jen Linse, Jaime Fortier – *two other persons to be appointed by the Congregation Council*
  - Sugar Creek Bible Camp – Naoko Giblin, Jeff Haldeman
  - Eagle Crest Communities – Carolyn Karl, Jim Michelson
- Adopted the budget proposal for 2023, noting that the budget presents some challenges for the congregation.
- Adopted the Mission Endowment Fund proposal for 2023 as presented.
- Heard that a significant gift to support the tech project and Sugar Creek Camperships has been received from Jean McCall, who grew up in this congregation.
- Heard a report on upcoming property needs over the next few needs, including the roof and parking lot.

The meeting closed with prayer, as we celebrated the blessings of a good and gracious God!



## Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, January 9, with President Jen Linse presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in discussion and prayer centering on the first of our Guiding Principles – “Jesus is Lord and Savior.”
- Approved the minutes of the December 12, 2022 Council Meeting, and received the December financial report.
- Heard a report from the pastors on ministries over the past month, and goals for the coming months.
- Decided to invite Pastor Dione Stepanek, Assistant to Bishop Malpica, to preach here on May 6/7.
- Voted to recommend to the annual meeting the budget proposal as presented.
- Reviewed the Mission Endowment Fund disbursement proposal for annual meeting consideration.
- Noted that nominees are secured for all positions except two voting members for synod assembly.
- Heard an update on property projects including the tech work and the flat portion of the roof.
- Heard that a gift of around \$60,000 is in the process of being given to the congregation. \$50,000 would be placed in a “campership” fund for Sugar Creek participants, with only the earnings used each year. The balance would be used for the tech project.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, February 13 at 7 PM. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior’s, contact Jen Linse or one of the pastors.

## **Financial Support Ministry**

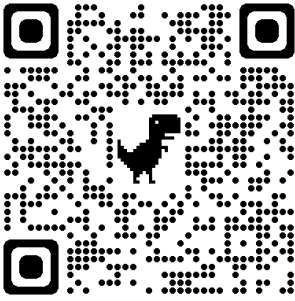
