But, I am excited for the fall ... I love the cooler, crisp weather, the leaves changing colors, and football! Friday night as we sat on our deck we could hear the crowd at the high school cheering and yelling during the first football game of the season ... a wild game it had to be ... we couldn't help but be drawn in just from listening and feeling the excitement! (West Salem beat Onalaska in overtime!)

I'm also excited for new beginnings ... reconnecting ... here at church. *There are so many things to be drawn into, to be a part of ...*



So many times, we hear from others what a welcoming place Our Savior's is. You are a part of making that happen. A simple smile, a warm 'hello', engaging someone you don't recognize in conversation, a listening ear ... being a part of the "Welcoming Team" greeting people before a worship service ...

The camera is really powerful, so no zooming in on the Pastor's nose, or ear, or a spot on our collar!

We are fed by the enthusiasm of our children and young adults. The sounds of babies crying and cooing, the chattering of children, tells us there is new life, new energy in our midst. Sunday School and confirmation provides "formal" ways to educate our young people. Caring adults share their faith with the kids, and the kids share their faith with us.

As our kids get older, we don't want them to think they are forgotten, because they're not. After watching them grow through Sunday School and confirmation, all of their activities in high school, then they go away to college. We do our best to **keep connected with our college students** to let them know they are in our thoughts and prayers.

Education isn't just for the young ... children aren't the only ones seeking to be fed with God's Word. Pastor Jon has a Wednesday morning Bible study where he loves to **delve into the scripture for the week**, but they are also known to get side-tracked as there is always time for sharing and

A group meets monthly for treats and conversation at Linda's Bakery. And, we are ready to resume OWLS (Older Wiser Lutherans over 55) – got some ideas for what you'd like to do??

Ministry happens within our walls ... but ministry also happens as we reach outside our walls ...

- * Communion is brought to our homebound members a time for conversation and care. If you have the "gift of gab" join us!
- * Quilts are made that will go around the world providing warmth, color, and even shelter for those in need.
- * Prayer shawls are crafted and gifted to those who need to feel God's love surrounding them whether it be in times of need or times of joy.
- * The food pantry provides groceries for neighbors who may be experiencing a difficult time in their lives.
- * Feed Our Children allows children to have a nutritious lunch (and breakfast) during the summer months.
- * The annual corn roast is our gift to the community, a way to thank our neighbors for partnering with us.
- * The Norwegian Dinner allows us to provide resources for many different organizations that help others in need in our local community and beyond ... plus it's fun!
- * We have a dedicated group whose passion is World Hunger who help educate us and encourage us to care for others across the globe.

Notice all the stuff in bold ... lots happening, not just to stay busy, but to be a blessing to the world (Genesis 12:2-3), to make a difference in the lives of others, and to be the presence of Jesus in our little corner of the world.

Confirmation Ministry

Confirmation ministry is getting ready for a new year of "disciple making." This year, however, there will be some **changes**!

The Congregation Council has affirmed eliminating small groups and combining the 7th-9th grade years into a 7th-8th grade cycle. That means 8th graders will be confirmed this coming April as will 9th graders (on a different Sunday). And it means that this year will be a transition year. How will that all work?

6th grade remains the same (why mess with success?). Corey Sjoquist will lead 6th graders through the Bible from Genesis to the building of the Church in the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. Classes meet on Wednesdays at 6 PM. See the schedule below.

7th **grade** will meet each week at 6 PM, except the last Wednesday of the month. Pastor Jon will teach the Catechetical material – Sacraments, Apostle's Creed, and the Ten Commandments – while Becky Murphy again teaches Servant Leadership. In addition, a series of electives taught by a variety of folk, will also be a part of the learning. See the schedule below.

8th **grade** will now meet on Wednesdays at <u>7 PM</u>, and will include prayer and the Lord's Prayer, and Servant Leadership, along with what had been part of the 9th grade material.

9th grade will join with the 8th graders on the nights when the previous 9th grade material is shared.

Hungry Jar Offering for September – Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR)

Multiple wildfires have broken out on the Hawaiian island of Maui. Exacerbated by strong winds, wildfires on Maui have claimed dozens of lives and have destroyed homes, businesses and lines of communication. Thousands of people are under evacuation orders, some moving to other Hawaiian Islands. Wildfires have also affected the Big Island of Hawaii, and the islands remain vulnerable to more fires this season. As of this writing, hurricanes are pounding California, as well, and LDR will be there helping them too.

LDR is coordinating with the Pacifica Synod and other partners to assess the needs of people impacted by the wildfires in Hawaii and hurricanes in California. LDR will work with them to provide for immediate needs and recovery amid the widespread destruction. LDR is committed to accompanying recovering communities in the years ahead.

Feed Our Children Summer Lunch Program



Our little corner of the church basement is all cleaned up for the

season. I want to send out a huge thank you to all of the members of our congregation who have made this season's Summer Lunch Program possible. Many of you volunteered your time preparing, serving or delivering. Many of our most needed item donations came from our congregation and that really helps keep our overall costs down quite a bit.

As we all know, prices for many things are much higher than they have been in the past. Large donations came from the West Salem Lions, Hansen's IGA, West Salem Schools, Linda's Bakery, Decker Design Inc., Marine Credit Union and many memorials and individuals. We also applied for and received a significant grant from Kwik Trip this year which was all the milk for breakfasts and lunches for two weeks and most of the produce also. The Community Care and Share Food Pantry provided bags of meal items for all of our pickups and deliveries - twice!

This year we had 7 weekly leaders - representing Our Savior's: Abby Johnson, Carla Burkhardt, Judy & Phil Gilbert and myself; Cheryl Lang from St. Teresa's of Kolkata; Sherie Brunk from Prince of Peace; and Nick Miller from the Presbyterian Church. Their help in organizing a week or two of volunteers is very helpful. Connie Pinski shared her Thrivent grant with us and shopped for produce several weeks in a row.

On a personal note: before the season began I was invited to attend a LaCrosse County meeting regarding food insecurity. Various organizations were represented at that

meeting including the Food Pantry. Strengths, and gaps were discussed and partnerships were made.

One of the ways that we make a big difference is by partnering with the Boys and Girls Club of West Salem. They provide structured and supervised activities throughout the summer and we are able to get food to those kids. Nothing that we send there is wasted, if there are ever any leftovers, they are used the next day.

Throughout the summer, we have received many words and notes of thanks. Our delivery drivers came back with positive feedback almost every time. Working in various ways every week in the summer really allows me to personally witness the good of so many. Thank you for your support in providing this service.

Building Projects and then... Storm Damage!

We are still awaiting the building projects approved in June,

including a new flat roof, lights off the Leonard Street entrance, and tuckpointing. Our project managers at DBS will ensure that the projects are completed ... completely!

Shortly, a Capital Campaign will commence to secure the funding for these and other building projects in the near future.

Meanwhile, we are also working on the storm damage from the storm in late July. Broken windows will soon be replaced. At this writing we are still awaiting inspection of the roof and an insurance adjuster to address damaged siding on the steeple.

The good news? No one was hurt ... and the work of Jesus continues!



Capital Fund Appeal

As we begin our roof work and other projects that need to be accomplished, we invite your support of our mission and ministry through our Capital Fund Appeal. Letters will be going out shortly to share with you God's call, our vision of ministry, and our invitation to you to join with us.

It has been over 30 years since Our Savior's had a capital campaign. Time to do it – and set

us up with the resources we will need for the next generation. We have an initial need of \$158,000, to cover roof, lighting, and tuckpointing, projects that will be completed this fall. Of that amount, \$50,000 is already on hand. Longer term we expect in the next 6-7 years projects totaling an additional \$300,000 (at today's costs).

Specifically, we ask you to consider a three-year gift over your regular giving, that would get us started and moving ahead. Your Congregation Council has already unanimously made the commitment to support this appeal. Details will be in the letter,

but you can get a head start by making your gift now – mark your check "building fund," or go to oursaviorswestsalem.org/giving, or use our QR code.

Thank you for your support of our work together. Together, as we proclaim the good news of Jesus, we make a difference in a very hurting world!





Tech Project Update


Up ... and soon running!

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, August 14, with President Jeff Haldeman presiding.

At this meeting the council:

- Shared in devotions based on 1 Corinthians 1.
- Approved the minutes from the July meeting, and received financials for that month and the pastors' reports.

- Affirmed the recommendation to modify the confirmation ministry.

- Heard that the Capital Fund Appeal team will meet this week; all members of the council affirmed their support for the capital fund appeal, and their intention to participate in the appeal.
- Discussed the compilation assembled at the July meeting regarding our story as a congregation. Alison and Bonnie will meet with the pastors to articulate the story and craft a way to share that story with Bethany Lutheran Church in Mauston.
- Discussed some ideas for connecting with Bethany in the coming months. Pastor Jean will follow up with Bethany.

By the numbers...



Ministry is not a numbers game, but numbers can help us get a feel for what is happening as we carry out our part of God's work in the world! Numbers help us

measure our faithful response to God's call, both in our financial support and our worship life. So...here is a snapshot of our ministry...by the numbers!

2023 Ministry at Work
