


## Exhibitor Information

## Exhibitor Parking

When possible, we encourage exhibitors to park their vehicles in the reserved parking.

Trailers that are not used for display or are not a necessary part of your camping facilities should be parked in the trailer area on the far side of the racetrack.

## Wristbands

Wristbands, which should be worn at all times, allow the wearer access to the showgrounds all weekend.

## Exhibitor Identification Cards

We encourage you to fill out an entry card for each item you display. One card (along with sheet protector and zip ties to secure it to your equipment) is enclosed in your registration packet. Markers and additional cards are available at Exhibitor Registration.

Please note that your Entry Number is the same as your packet number.

## Parade of Power and Engine Crank-Up

We invite you to participate in our daily Parade of Power. **All parade entries need to register with Parade Registration prior in the parade.** Your parade number should be displayed either on the front of the vehicle or on the right hand side (when viewed from the front).

Parade entries should line up at 12:30 PM near the threshing field; parade rolls at 1 PM. Please note that route runs clockwise around the fairgrounds.

If you have stationary equipment, we invite you to join in the daily Engine Crank-up at 2 PM.

You are, of course, welcome to run your equipment at any time during the show.

## Early Registration Drawing

Everyone who registered by July 31 is eligible to win one of two \$25 gift cards. Winners will be chosen at random at 4 PM on Friday, August 30. You don't need to be present at the drawing to win; however you do need to attend the show. Officers and Directors of the Association are ineligible.

## Exhibitor Appreciation Drawing

As a token of our gratitude to exhibitors who stay until the end of the show, we will be giving away two \$50 gift cards. The drawing will take place at the Museum at 4 PM on Monday, September 2. Must be present to win. Officers and Directors of the Association are ineligible.

## Getting Around the Show

Generally speaking, modern vehicles should not be driven on the fairgrounds during show hours. Antique Autos and tractors may be freely driven during the show. Personal transportation such as golf carts, quad bikes, bicycles, etc. is also permitted. **Tractors and other vehicles are not allowed on the rack track.** Please operate any form of transport with due diligence, always being mindful of pedestrians and observing a 10 MPH speed limit

You can also use our free tractor trolley. The route includes stops at the ticket gate, the exhibition area, the flea market, Antique Village, and the reserved parking area.

## Food

A variety of food is available for purchase on the fairgrounds.

Breakfast is served from 7-9 AM at the Ruth Butler Building on Saturday, Sunday and Monday. The Pie Sale is held in the Indoor Flea Market (Miracle of Life Building). In Antique Village, the Cook Shack offers soups and sandwiches. While the Ice Cream Shop serves up hand-dipped cones and floats. In the exhibition area, grab an ear of our famous "steamed" corn cooked by a Port Huron steam engine.

You'll also find other food vendors on the grounds, and there are several fast food and casual dining restaurants located near the showgrounds.

## Community Worship Service

A non-denominational worship service is held on Sunday at 9 AM in the Village Chapel.

Our informal tractor pull begins at 2 PM on Sunday. There are no classes, and the only award is bragging rights. Drivers must be 14 years of age or older. Enter at your own risk

## **General Safety Policies**

It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that their equipment is operated properly and safely. Check your equipment before start up.

Gasoline or other combustibles must be kept in a proper container and stored in a safe manner.

Engines must be shut down before refuelling.

Turn off fuel tank valves when parked.

Running engines or equipment must not be left unattended.

All running displays should be roped off.

No riders are allowed on tractors without fenders.

Steam engines are to be attended at all times while under a full head of steam.

Know where your fire extinguisher is and how to use it.

You must be at least 18 years of age to operate any equipment owned by the U.P. Steam and Gas Engine Association.

All animals shall be leashed. Please pick up after your animal.

No bare feet on show grounds.

No alcoholic beverages permitted in the exhibition areas during show hours.

The U. P. Steam and Gas Engine Association reserves the right to eject from the fairgrounds any person not adhering these guidelines.
