~ OCTOBER WORK BEE SCHEDULED ~



UP STEAM & GAS ENGINE ASSOCIATION STORAGE FEES

Due to the limited amount of space in our Village out buildings and north coast, we need to assess storage fees for all equipment that is NOT used during our Labor Day weekend show. All pieces of equipment that are NOT taken out of Village buildings or north coast for our Labor Day weekend show will be assessed the following yearly storage fees.

The board has appointed 2 people to check buildings during our show to verify what equipment is being used during our show. Equipment used during our Labor Day show are exempt from

storage fees. Storage fees will be \$40.00 for each small piece (4'x4' & smaller) and \$100.00 for each large piece (4'x4' & larger) stored indoors in the Village. Equipment stored in north coast storage fees will be \$30 for small piece (4'x4' & under) and \$75 for large piece (4'x4' & larger).

Storage fees are due by Labor Day 2023 (9/4/23). Checks can be made out to: U.P. Steam & Gas Engine Association and can be dropped off in the General Store during the Labor Day weekend show. If storage fees are 30 days past due, equipment owner will be sent a letter advising of past due fees. If fees are not paid within 30 days of receiving 1st letter, equipment will be moved to the outside of buildings and will need to be removed from the Village by May 19th, 2024. ~ MUSEUM UPDATE ~

~ SHOP MANAGER EXPENDITURES REMINDER ~

Expenditures of \$250 two times per year (\$500 annual maximum) are allowed. Shop Managers must have Board approval prior to any expenditures over the \$500 annual maximum. Please contact the Club Treasurer with any questions and/or to request approval if you have a needed expense.

~ VOLUNTEER HOURS OPPORTUNITY (Revised) ~

Since our Labor Day Weekend Show is continuously growing and costs have increased there is a need for changes in our Club. Due to rising operating costs for our Labor Day weekend show, we need to make some changes. At our January Board meeting it was voted & approved to implement a volunteer hour opportunity. A summary of the opportunity criteria is as follows:

• 5 hours volunteer time for an individual member and 10 hours volunteer time for a family per calendar year (Jan 1 - Dec 31). One (1) person from a family can contribute all 10 hours.

- Lifetime members are exempt from volunteer hour requirements.
- If volunteer hours are met during the year of 2023, the camping fee of \$60.00 will be waived at our 2024 Labor Day weekend show.
- If volunteer hours are NOT met during the 2023 year, the camping fee of \$60.00 will be charged to the member who is using a camping space at our 2024 Labor Day weekend show.

This criteria is effective and will back date to January 1, 2023. The members that attended the January 7th Work Bee will be credited for the hours worked.

Board and Membership meetings will not count towards volunteer hours.

Starting in 2024, members & non-members will be charged \$60 for camping at our Labor Day show Thursday- Monday.

Volunteer hours can be completed during Work Bees, U.P. State Fair, Labor Day Show, Christmas in the Village and any Club activity that help is needed at. I will continue to post on our Members Only Facebook and email anytime we are needing help.
