George Washington's Birthday 2024

February 19th

Today, George Washington's Birthday is celebrated on the third Monday in February. George Washington was born in Virginia on February 11, 1731, according to the then-used Julian calendar. In 1752, however, Britain and all its colonies adopted the Gregorian calendar which moved Washington's birthday a year and 11 days to February 22, 1732.

Americans celebrated Washington's Birthday long before Congress declared it a federal holiday. The centennial of his birth prompted festivities nationally and Congress established a Joint Committee to arrange for the occasion. At the recommendation of the Committee, Congress adjourned on February 22, 1832 out of respect for Washington's memory and in commemoration of his birth.

In 1862, the House and Senate commemorated the 130th Anniversary of Washington's birth by reading aloud his Farewell Address. It was considered a morale-boosting gesture during the darkest days of the Civil War.

No Senate tradition has been more steadfastly maintained than the annual reading of President George Washington's 1796 Farewell Address. In this letter to "Friends and Citizens," Washington warned that the forces of geographical sectionalism, political factionalism, and interference by foreign powers in the nation's domestic affairs threatened the stability of the republic. He urged Americans to subordinate sectional jealousies to common national interests.

Washington's Birthday did not become a legal holiday until January 31, 1879. Contrary to popular belief, neither Congress nor the President has ever stipulated that the name of the holiday observed as Washington's Birthday be changed to "President's Day."
