Created for Generosity

We are embarking on a stewardship month here at Zion. In the coming weeks of worship, we will be sharing stories of how we have experienced God's generosity through Zion Lutheran Church. We will have the opportunity to listen to one another stories and to think about what it means for each of us to grow in our stewardship of all of God's gifts that we have received. Stewardship as a faith practice reminds us that all that we have belongs to God, nothing is really ours. The Creator gives us what we need each day and invites us into relationship with others through those gifts. For me, stewardship is really a call to remember and reflect on God's generosity in our lives and how we can freely live into the grace and love of Jesus Christ through our everyday actions of faith.

Stewardship is not all about the money, but it is about money. Our relationship with money is important to reflect on, especially how God might be inviting us to have a different type of relationship with money than our culture often leads us into. We all have different experiences with money, different stories and memories of how money (having it or not having it) impacted our lives. We know that some of us simply seem to have more resources than others and this can cause great divisions in our community. How might God be inviting us to think about money and its impacts on how we feel about others and how we respond to the needs of our world?

Money is often a very personal topic, but not one that should be avoided in the church. Money can have a great impact in how we live out our faith. God invites us into the freedom of living generously not only with our money, but also with our time and our various gifts and talents that we have to offer the world. There is deep joy in living a generous life! In October, we will be working in various stewardship themes into Sunday worship and perhaps gently questioning and wondering about some of the cultural norms we have around the relationship of money and faith.

Then, on Sunday, October 22nd we are planning on having a New Member Welcome in worship and a Celebration of Ministry between services with cinnamon rolls and activities in the fellowship hall. We will be inviting all those who lead various ministry groups and activities that happen as a part of Zion Lutheran Church to share about what they do with table displays. Are you interested in learning more about how you can share your time and talents at Zion and in our community? Come to the Celebration of Ministry to learn more and share your ideas for what sort of ministry activities we could be doing as a church community in the coming year.

CHURCH COUNCIL

Church Council Meeting Minutes for Thursday, August 17th 2023

The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Rochon at 6:00 pm. Present were Vicky Holm, Lynn Rochon, Anthony Anderson, Pastor Sarah Gunderson, Christel Lewis, Aine Merrill, Margaret Sundet, Sarah Schubert McKone and Donna Meltz.

Devotions were given by Vicky. Aine will give them next month.

Treasurers Report: We reviewed the Check Register. The checking balance is \$13,554.09, the savings account is \$27,235.30, the Thrivent account is \$3,214.74 and the mortgage is at \$48,907.56. **Pastors Report**: Planning has started for the youth gathering next summer in New Orleans. Pastor Sarah is having a meeting this Tuesday for anyone interested in going. She is working on creating more welcoming spaces in our church building. There are now worship art supplies for anyone to use during worship services. She is also working on bringing back a Bible study. We discussed the possibility of a weekly newsletter instead of or in addition to the monthly newsletter. We discussed putting the announcements that are made in worship service in this weekly newsletter. No decision was made. 153 people attended the joint worship service at Our Saviors last Sunday. The offering that was collected, \$947, will be used for a joint project of helping the family of Amena to get here from Afghanistan. This is a joint project of the Lutheran churches in Superior and other local Lutheran churches working with the US government program called Welcome Core.

Discipleship: VBS had between 20 and 25 kids per day with 18 helpers. Sunday School and LOGOS will start in September. Sunday School will have the same hours as last year, 9:45 - 10:30, and the leaders will teach every 6 weeks and help the other 5 weeks. This is how it was run last year and it worked really well. **Worship and Music**: When we start 2 services again in September, they will not be called Traditional Service and Contemporary service. They will be called First Service and Second Service. They will be at the same times as before, 9 and 10:45. We will continue to have special music from the congregation. **Operations**: Paul Freer was at the meeting and we discussed the sewer issue that was uncovered when the city was updating the sewer line in front of the church. We cannot get an estimate of how much it will be to fix it. The mayor of Superior and the city Inspector are aware of the issue. Paul got an estimate of \$4,500 to get the parking lot patched and sealed. ABC Seamless fixed our fascia on the front and back of the church building.

Stewardship: Tim Ingersoll is the coordinator of the group and there is a meeting next week. They are planning a fall stewardship program.


WELCA: The group is on summer break but did help out with National Night Out. There were 100 hot dogs served that night. We got donations from A&W, Culvers, Super One and Kwik Trip. We would like to thank them and all the volunteers that came and helped out that night. The Superior High School String Quintet provided music. The Superior Chief of Police, Nick Alexander, and two officers were here as well. They were Office Swanson and Office Dipuma. The Station 3 Fire Department was here also. A motion was made by Sarah Schubert McKone and seconded by Vicky to accept all reports as given. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business: The review of the constitution is tabled for a later meeting. A new contract for the printer has been signed so the old printer is gone and we have a new printer. It is cheaper to print with the new printer. Tim Ingersoll's brother is making a new cup that is shallow so we can resume communion by intinction. We reviewed a new banner that will replace the current banner that is hanging outside by the front door that has our summer hours. The new banner has the winter schedule on it. The old wooden sign along 2^{nd} Street will be taken down and something else will be put up. The current sign makes our building look unoccupied.

New Business: Lynn will ask Paul to get another estimate for the parking lot sealant and repair. Since we have used most of the money in the church maintenance account for this budget year, we might need to have a special congregational meeting to approve that parking lot sealant expense. Danny Haworth is not interested in doing snowplowing for us this winter. Vicky will message someone she knows to see if they are interested and if they are, she will give their phone number to Paul.

A motion was made at 7:21 to adjourn by Sarah Schubert McKone and seconded by Donna. Motion carried.
