The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Rochon at 5:59pm. Present were Vicky Holm, Lynn Rochon, Pastor Sarah Gunderson, Christel Lewis, Aine Merrill, Margaret Sundet, Sara Schubert McKone, Grace Becken and Donna Meltz.

Devotions were given by Donna. Next month will be Anthony.

A motion was made by Donna and seconded by Vicky to accept last month's secretary's report. Motion carried. **Treasurer Report**: We reviewed the check register. We discussed how to keep the congregation informed on our financial status. Aine will put an update in the weekly bulletin once a month, after showing it to Pastor Sarah. Linda Brow and Greg Kvam have been invited to next month's council meeting to review the 2024 budget. The current checking account balance is \$8,463.66, the savings balance is \$27,269.25, the Thrivent account is \$3,214.74 and the mortgage is at \$43,282.56.

Pastor Report: Stewardship has been the focus for October. New members will be welcomed on October 22nd. They are Leslie and Phyllis Neubauer, Shannon and Justin Johnson with Linnea, Linden, Anastasia and August, Rusty and Jacquelynn Mehlberg with Molly and Micah, Sarah and Brett Gunderson with Noah, Lauren and Micah and Rachael Sawner. A motion was made by Lynn and seconded by Aine to accept the new members. Motion approved. Members that had been previously approved by council and welcomed at this Sunday's service are Joshua Christie and Stephanie and Tanner Becken with Grace, Joy and Tanner. There will also be a ministry celebration during coffee hour this Sunday. There will be an affirmation of Baptism on October 29th. They are Anastasia Johnson, Zachary Dittbrender, Owin Holm and Micah Gunderson. A motion was made by Vicky and seconded by Sara Schubert McKone to accept them for affirmation of baptism. Motion approved. There are 4 youth signed up for the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans this July. They are Pastor Sarah Gunderson, Vicky Holm and Tim Ingersoll. The budget is for \$1,300 per person for a total of \$9,100. \$7,375 is left to be fundraised, by having breakfasts, pie sale, cinnamon roll sale, Valentine's dinner, "Stock" sale and other events. November 12-14th Pastor will be in Wausau for the First Call Theological Retreat. On November 19th United Presbyterial Church invited us to a Thanksgiving Ecumenical service.

Discipleship: At LOGOS, the older youth are working on their stoles for their confirmation.

Worship and Music: They haven't met lately but were able to set a date and time so they can start meeting. **Operations**: Brett Gunderson took our old electronics to be recycled. The TV and VCR will be pulled out of the nursery room and put in next year's rummage sale. Sister Gretchen would like to use church to have piano lessons.


Stewardship: There is currently no meeting set but one will be held to discuss the outcome of the October events.

WELCA: They will have a cookie sale on Saturday, December 16th. They are not having a pie sale as the youth are having one for a fundraiser.

A motion was made by Vicky and seconded by Donna to accept all reports as given. Motion approved. **Unfinished Business:** We received 2 estimates to get our sewer fixed. If it can be gravity fed, the estimates are between \$30,000 and \$60,000. If a pump is needed, then it will be between \$60,000 and \$90,000 to get it fixed. The city of Superior is opening grants for non-profits and we are applying for a grant. The grant is written and being reviewed and will be turned in by the deadline, which is October 30th. We got an estimate for the sump pump replacement of \$5,560. This is above the amount the council can approve and will need congregational approval. A congregational meeting will be held November 5th. A motion was made by Donna and seconded by Grace to order the pump from Miller E-1 Pump and Repair since there is a 5 week turnaround. Motion carried. New Business: Since we started going back to in-person services, Sister Gretchen was still being paid her Covid salary instead of her regular salary. We need to make back payments to her. Someone backed into a sign that they claim was bent over into a parking space and damaged their truck. Lynn will check with Ken Mertz to see if we can send the check directly to Eisenmann Brothers, where they got an estimate for \$589.62. A motion was made by Vicky and seconded by Grace to send the money to whoever Ken advises us to, whether that be the repair shop or the person. Motion approved. The sign has been removed so it can't damage anyone else's vehicle. Pearl is retiring November 13th. The Personnel committee is working on a job description and will be doing the interviews of any applicants. They will bring any recommendations of candidates to the council when they have one. We reviewed the calendar events: New member Sunday is October 22 along with Volunteer Opportunities Information. Affirmation of Baptism is October 29th with one service at 10am. That day is also Trunk-or-Treat. Pasty bake is November $8^{th} - 11^{th}$.

A motion was made at 7:26pm by Sara Schubert McKone and seconded by Grace to adjourn. Motion carried.

Children will be dismissed from the service at 9:45 to be part of the Sunday School Time. God loves our children and has wonderful things to teach them at Zion Sunday School. Sunday School meets from 9:45am-10:30am. No Sunday School on Dec. 24 & 31. EVERYONE IS WELCOME!
