# Church Council

#### Church Council Meeting Minutes for Thursday, February 15th, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Rochon at 6:07pm. Present were Lynn Rochon, Pastor Sarah Gunderson, Aine Merrill, Sara Schubert McKone, Grace Becken, Margaret Sundet, Donna Meltz, Shannon Johnson, Don Anderson, and Anthony Anderson. Absent Christel Lewis.

Devotions were given by Donna. Next month will be Aine.

A motion was made by Sara and seconded by Donna to accept last month's secretary report. Motion carried.

**Treasurer Report:** Continuation of discussion of what to include in the bulletin for financial information for the congregation. Greg Kvam will attend the March council meeting to review and discuss eliminating dedicated funds categories on financial reporting. As of 2/15/24 current checking account balance is \$4,926.22, the savings balance is \$20,070.00, and the remaining mortgage due is\$41,584.29.

**Pastor Report:** Pastor Sarah reviewed our vision and mission at Zion. She discussed the results from the annual meeting and how we can bring the ideas of the congregation into Zion and the community. The general feeling is we have quite a few ideas, but are unsure as to how to proceed. Discussion about the upcoming Superior ELCA church collaboration on February 25th at Concordia. Pastor completed grief training, and plans to organize a support group. Lent theme is Wandering Heart. A small group will be meeting Tuesdays to discuss the theme. A collaborative art project and banners are in the works for the sanctuary. The ELCA youth gathering continues to fundraise. Next event is Friday, February 16th organized by Vicky Holm. Additional days have been added to their trip plans to gather and do service work with other youth groups in Memphis. She will be on vacation March 8-15 and will be absent for worship March 10 and March 13.

**Committee Reports - Discipleship:** Continue to have 4-12 children weekly in Sunday school, LOGOS is helping with readings and Lent services on Wednesday. No Sunday school on February 25th due to combined service. Save the date - VBS will be Aug 5-8 to coordinate with National Night Out. March 2nd will be spring cleaning with breakfast at 8:30am.

**Worship and Music:** Lent has begun! The cross at the front of the church has been draped with fabric and plans for Easter plants and flowers have begun.

**Operations:** The sewer saga continues. The repairs have begun. A hole was dug to replace the sewer pipe in the basement and the grease trap was pumped. Next a 5x5 hole will be dug to install the new pipe with a pump and then they will move all pipes together in place. Entire project will be completed in a matter of weeks. The sump pump project is also in the works. Unfortunately, they sent the wrong pump, but the correct one is on the way and will be installed upon receipt. The project is currently coming in under budget. Original budget is \$93,000 and it

currently sits at \$60,000. It was recommended to find small projects that could bridge the gap. **Stewardship:** Planning a fun event May 3rd - pj party! Come celebrate with root beer floats, games and music. Still trying to figure out a layout for communicating finances with the congregation in the weekly bulletin.

**WELCA:** Sub sandwich sale was a success with 84 sandwiches sold, \$485 profit. 18 subs were put in the food shelf and thank you to Super One for their donation. Possible luncheon or salad bar in the works. A motion was made by Donna and seconded by Grace to accept all reports as given. Motion approved.

**Unfinished Business - Constitution Review:** Bylaws review. Recommended to change the operations committee to property committee. Also call to reestablish the finance committee. Call for a special meeting to approve changes, announce March 3rd, special meeting March 24 at 10:00am coffee time during Palm Sunday.

**New Business - New Year vision sheet:** How do we bring new members to the church? What can we do to bring these congregational ideas to light? Ongoing conversation.

**Mailboxes:** Paul has asked to redo the list for mailboxes and reassign mailboxes to members. Many of the mailboxes belong to members who no longer attend Zion. Don brought up concerns that people may want to keep their mailboxes. Recommended that an announcement be made about if you would like to keep your mailbox to let Paul in the office know.

A motion was made at 7:40pm by Donna and seconded by Grace to adjourn. Motion carried. Next meeting March 21st, 2024 at 6:00pm. Submitted by Sara Schubert McKone

# Church Council

Council, Budget, and Annual Meeting, oh my!

It probably doesn't come as a surprise to most of you, but serving on church council is both a blessing and a challenge. The blessings should be obvious—sitting down monthly with some really amazing individuals to discuss what is being done at Zion and what needs doing. And there's the treats. Snacking is not an option at council!

For most of us, I suspect, the main challenges center around the unknown. We are planning for future events and eventualities which may or may not happen with resources which mostly are not here yet. It's kind of like planning for a road trip when you don't yet have the car. It can be stressful, scary, and exciting, all at the same time.

One doesn't have to look very far to see that most churches are still struggling to return to their pre-Pandemic states. Through no fault of their own, people got out of the habit of church attendance and are working towards trying to get back into that rhythm again. Some have been gone so long that they feel uncomfortable thinking about going back to church because they, well, have been gone for so long that maybe they'll feel like an outsider. (By the way, if that is you or someone you know, there is always a place for you at Zion—no questions asked. We will always be delighted to see you, so put that thought to rest).

Here at Zion, we are experiencing a slow and steady growth. Our congregation has come together, under Pastor Sarah's leadership, to seek ways to serve our community both inside and outside our doors. We are in our second year of having Sunday School back, our youth group is thriving, and we are sending some high school youth and mentors to the ELCA Youth Convention in New Orleans this summer—something that hasn't happened in over a decade. We have gifted people sharing musical talents, the bell choir is back, quilts are being made, we're baking those pasties twice a year, and dedicated members are caring for the church grounds and building. We are determined, with God's guidance, to have a place for worship, service, celebrations, as well as a place for support, mourning and comfort far into the future.

At the end of January, we held our annual meeting. One of the tasks at that meeting is to set the budget to allow our church to function for the year. The budget set for 2023 was about 126,000. Our budget for 2024 is 167,000. This increase is based mostly on staffing needs: calling a full-time pastor, hiring a new office manager, and increasing that salary to what is provided by the other churches in Superior, and increasing the hours of the custodian from the pandemic level of 10 hours a week to a more reasonable 20 hours a week. There is nothing frivolous in our budget—the amounts reflect the bare necessities.

And this is where the "Oh, my!" part comes in. Now we show up, do the work that we are called to do, and watch God at work as well. Last summer we found out that we would need to update our sewer system. It was pretty scary to consider that we might need to find 90,000 to make the repairs. Then, the City of Superior opened a grant process for non-profits, and we were awarded a grant to fully fund the project. All I could say was, "Oh, my!" Do we think that miraculously we'll get the money to meet our budget in one "oh my" moment? Nope. But we're learning to trust that we are not in this work alone. And God is good.

So, what can we do to help our church continue to be here for the long haul? Prayer is appreciated. Come to worship and participate in as many events as you can. Invite a friend if you feel so moved. Can you contribute a little more in time, talents or financially? Feel free to do so. And share any ideas you have with Pastor or your council members. We value and appreciate you!
