The season of Easter is drawing to a close dear Church, and the Day of Pentecost is almost here! In his farewell discourse to the disciples, Jesus promises them that "*when the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth*" (John 16:13). On the Day of Pentecost, we celebrate that the Holy Spirit came to them just as Jesus said, and to the generations of disciples that came after including us! The Spirit comes to guide us all in the ways of truth and to help us believe in the Good News of God's grace in Jesus Christ and live as God's faithful people.

There is so much happening in our world today, so much more it seems than in Jesus' day. We are constantly bombarded with information and news from everywhere, pressures to believe and respond appropriately to issues we don't even fully understand, and it can be difficult to discern truth from fiction. We need the Spirit of truth to guide us more than ever! How can we listen and pay attention to the leading of the Spirit?


This has been the work of the Christian Church from its very beginning. The chaos of the Day of Pentecost, as told to us in Acts 2, formed a community that needed to work together to discern what was happening around them so they could act with purpose and faith. The Spirit allowed them all to hear the Gospel declared in a language they understood and heard as good news. We need practices that help us sort out the noise and confusion of our day so we can hear the Good News of Jesus too and respond in ways that give life.

I think the practices of discipleship that the Church has been cultivating for centuries to participate in the leading of the Spirit are still good. The Spirit is still leading us as we gather to worship and pray, as we study Scripture and learn about the world around us, as we practice giving generously of ourselves to serve and love our neighbors. As we do the things that Jesus taught us, we practice being a community led by the Spirit in the chaos of this world. Our Zion church congregation has been doing this work of following the Spirit together for 130 years now! And we're still looking pretty good!

On May 19th in our worship services, we will celebrate the Day of Pentecost and the birthday of the Christian Church. You are invited to wear red in honor of the Holy Spirit, to come to worship to be renewed in your call to be a disciple of Jesus, and to remember the gift of the Spirit given to you and the whole church in baptism. It will be a wonderful celebration indeed. Thanks be to God!

Church Council

Church Council Meeting Minutes for Thursday, March 21st, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Rochon at 6:02pm. Present were Christel Lewis, Aine Merrill, Margaret Sundet, Pastor Sarah Gunderson, Sara Schubert McKone, Shannon Johnson and Lynn Rochon.

Devotions were given by Aine Merrill. Next month will be Lynn Rochon. A motion was made by Christel and seconded by Sara to accept last month's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report: The checking balance is \$9,062.54, the savings balance is \$15,000.00 and the mortgage is at \$40,244.61. Greg Kvam couldn't be at tonight's meeting. He will be here next month to review and discuss eliminating dedicated fund categories on the financial reports.

Pastors Report: We are wrapping up the Lenten journey in Sunday worship, Tuesday small groups (inperson and Zoom) and Wednesday bible study. We have had art projects and faith stories on Wednesday evenings along with worship led by our Logos group. Holy Week will include Maundy Thursday worship with First Communion, Good Friday with Prayer stations and Saturday Easter Vigil service with s'mores. Easter Sunday worship is at 9am and 10:45am at Zion, Sunrise Ecumenical Service at 6:45am at Wisconsin Point Lot #1. Logos Youth Easter Breakfast is at 8:30 - 10:30am. Our Superior ELCA churches are working to support a young woman from Afghanistan named Amena, who is hoping to bring her family here to the Duluth/ Superior area. Amena arrived in Duluth in January 2022 after fleeing her home when the Taliban took over power in Afghanistan. She had been working for the US military at the time, and so it was not safe for her to stay. Through the Welcome Corps program, the churches are working to form a team that can help bring her mother and 2 siblings to live with her here. An interest meeting will be held at Pilgrim Lutheran on Tuesday, April 23rd at 6pm for anyone who wants to learn more about this project and how you can help. We have taken offerings at our last two shared worship services and will be working jointly to fundraise about \$5,000 more in the next few months to support this effort. Bishop Laurie will visit the LOGOS youth on April 3rd, Holy Humor is Sunday, April 7th and The Youth LOGOS Retreat will be Friday, April 19th, details still being worked out for that.

Discipleship: Sunday School's last day will be May 19 with a graduate recognition Sunday and LOGOS last day will be May 8th. Eater breakfast is being served by the LOGOS for a fundraiser for their group. **Worship and Music**: They are thinking about how they can use the PVC pipe/supports on the back of the altar. We will be going to one Sunday service starting on Memorial weekend, Sunday May 26th.

Stewardship: They are brainstorming spring and fall drives, like PBS does spring and fall membership drives. They are planning on having outdoor activities on June 19th. The same company that makes the waving arm man on Tower Ave also makes a Jesus waving man. They are discussing if we should get that and put it out, just once in a while. They are also discussing creating a gathering space where the playground equipment used to be.

WELCA: A lunch is planned in May at Perkins for the women of Zion. On Thursday, April 11th they will be cleaning the kitchen.

A motion was made by Christel and seconded by Margaret to accept all reports as given. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business: A special congregational meeting will be on Sunday, April 21st to accept the changes to the constitution. It will be announced at the services on April 7th and 14th.

Paul is still determining if mailboxes will be reassigned. We will discuss New Year Visioning at the next council meeting.

New Business: We will discuss the financial reports at the next council meeting when Greg is here. The sub pump project was completed late this afternoon. The sewer project is also complete. We wrote thank you notes to all the Lutheran churches in Superior for supporting our food shelf, to our City Council representative the City Plumbing Inspector and Dan Ingersoll for the Ping Pong table he donated.

A motion was made at 7:24pm by Christel and seconded by Shannon to adjourn. Motion carried.
